**ONT. BOARDS OF TRADE TO VISIT HERE THIS FALL**

Group of Toronto and Other Southern Ontario Business Men Expect to Tour North in September.

Mr. H. Webb, president of the Timmins Board of Trade, last week received a letter from Mr. W. H. Alderson, of Toronto, regarding the newspaper reports to the effect that the Toronto Board of Trade has had to cancel the proposed excursion to the North Land this summer. Mr. Alderson says:—"In reply, would say that this information is a little previous because it is our intention to make a trip north this year, but in place of having members of the Toronto Board of Trade only we intend to have members of the Associated Boards throughout Ontario. The trip will likely be made in September and we hope to have a fairly good turnout. I shall write you again at a later date regarding the time set, the number we hope to have, and other particulars."

Mr. Alderson has been appointed chairman of the Excursion Committee and is hopeful of good results from the proposed visit.

The people generally in the North Land will be pleased to receive the visit from the business men of the south and it is to be hoped that a large and representative party will visit here and see the country for themselves. The business men of the South should have a particular interest in Timmins as this town has been recognized for some time past as one of the most prosperous and go-ahead towns in the Province, as well as a splendid customer for Toronto and other southern centres. The visit here of the business men of Old Ontario should do much to correct many false impressions of the North Land and assure the support of the southern business men in securing all the North Land asks—a fair chance and a square deal.

**HINTS FOR CAMPERS IN THE FOREST**

Be sure your match is out. Pinch it before you throw it away.

Build a small camp-fire. Build it in the open, not against a tree or log or near brush. Scrape away the trash from all around it.

Never leave a camp-fire, even for a short time, without quenching it with water and then covering it with earth.

If you find a fire, try to put it out. If you cannot extinguish it, send word of it to the nearest Forest Ranger.

Throw pipe ashes and cigar or cigarette stumps in the dust of the road and stamp or pinch out the fire before leaving them. Don't throw pipe ashes and cigar or cigarette stumps into brush, leaves, or pine needles.

**BOYS ALL GET A GOOD CHANCE IN JUVENILE COURT**

Magistrate Atkinson had a problem last Thursday in the case of the five boys accused of breaking the seal of a freight car and stealing a quantity of fruit, but the Magistrate handled the case with his usual good judgment and far-sightedness and the boys have another chance to go along to good citizenship. On the one hand breaking the seal of a freight car is an offence that can not be lightly viewed and the entering of a car for the purpose of stealing fruit is a much more serious affair than just boyish mischief. In addition some of the boys concerned had been in difficulties with the authorities before and warning in their case had not been altogether effective. On the other hand, the boys were all young, and Magistrate Atkinson always likes to give the boys the best of chances. Inspector LeHeup, of the Children's Aid Society, was present at the court to see if anything could be done for the boys. The Magistrate settled the matter by allowing one of the boys to go out on his uncle's farm where he will be less likely to get into mischief. Two of the other boys were ordered to report weekly to Chief Greer and the other two lads were given their freedom on suspended sentence. Magistrate Atkinson very patiently but very seriously impressed on the lads the troubles that would come to them from following the foolish path they had started upon, and the good chance they had to develop into useful and respected citizens. The lads appeared to be much impressed by the Magistrate's words, and with a little special care and attention these bright boys will no doubt develop into very good citizens.
