THURSDAY "HOME BREW" WEEK AT POLICE COURT

Thursday was a very busy day for Magistrate Atkinson at the police court here. Most of the cases had to do with things that do not please Hon. Mr. N. M. Raney, but there were also some cases of criminal offences.

Geo. Chipechuk faced a charge of the theft of \$2000.00, and though Mr. A. C. Brown, his solicitor, made a strong plea for the dismissal of the case on account of lack of evidence, the accused was committed for trial before a judge. The evidence suggested that two men who had been room-mates of the accused lost sums totalling \$2000, and suspicion fell upon Chipechuk who was arrested at North Bay. When arrested he had \$600.00 in his possession, but he claimed he was lawfully entitled to this money.

A charge of forgery in connection with a cheque was heard against W. Kennig. The charge was dismissed.

The case against P. Shinoff of assaulting John Martinechuk was dismissed. The evidence indicated that when Mrs. Shinoff dunned John for an account he used language and this brought Mr. Shinoff into action, with the result that John was what is scientifically termed, "ejected from the premises with sufficient force to assure his departure therefrom."

D. Sharp, a young man, faced a charge of housebreaking and theft on June 5th. An overcoat and other articles were alleged to have been taken by him. He was committed for trial at Haileybury.

Three drunks were fined, one \$10.00 and the other two \$20.00 and costs.

Two auto owners were fined \$1.00 and costs for parking on the wrong side of the street and another autoist the same penalty for driving on the wrong side of the silent police. The fine and costs in each case totalled \$4.50. The purpose of these prosecutions is to secure full observance of the Provincial and Town laws and regulations for the safety of the public.

Steve Kohjovick was charged with shooting duck on Sunday. He failed to appear to answer to the charge. A fine of \$40.00 and costs was imposed and a warrant issued for Steve's arrest.

John Dunn for illegally having unlawful apparatus for liquor making in his possession was fined \$500.00 and costs or six months.

Mike Sharzeles for having in his possession spirits unlawfully manufactured pleaded guilty and was fined \$200.00 and costs, or six months.

J. Koroski on a charge of having illegally in his possession spirits unlawfully manufactured was fined \$200.00 and costs or six months.

D. Charonski for unlawfully having

apparatus for the illegal manufacture of spirits was fined \$500.00 and costs, or six months, as well as a penalty of thirty days in jail apart from the fine.

W. Forest on the charge of unlawfully taking lumber from the Success Mine property was allowed to go on paying off the lumber and the costs. A number of witnesses testified to the good character of the accused, and the improbability of his intending knowingly to do anything illegal.

ELBOW LAKE GOLD CAMP ATTRACTS MUCH ATTENTION

Writing in The Pas (Manitoba) Herald last week, Mr. Reece H. Hague says:—

"We of the north, have long known that we have at our doorstep one of the richest mineral bearing regions of the world, but it is only comparatively recently that this fact has been brought home to the mining fraternity of the outside world. One of the most satisfactory features of the boom at present under way in Northern Manitoba is the fact that the press, not only of Western Canada, but of Eastern Canada, the United States, Great Britain, and, in fact the whole of the civilized world, has at last come to a realization of the great mineral future of our district. While, naturally, there is a tendency on the part of the large mineral interests at present exploring properties in Northern Manitoba to preserve a certain degree of reticence regarding developments, the news which does seep through to The Pas is of such a satisfactory nature as to encourage the highest hopes. Reliable men speak very highly of the new fields, and activity is by no means confined to the Elbow lake sector but extends for many miles. Work is progressing steadily at Copper lake, where the Nipissing company are diamond drilling a large sulphide body, and are said to have gone down a considerable distance through solid sulphides and then encountered quartz vein running parallel. Preparations are being made to diamond drill some of the claims at Flin-Flon, and indications point to the operation of this property being not far distant. Prospectors are busy at Herb lake, where a recent rich discovery attracted considerable attention. Noah A. Timmins, president of Hollinger Consolidated Gold Mines Ltd., has made his plans for visiting Elbow lake about the middle of June, and despatches from Montreal state that there are high hopes in that city that another extremely rich camp has been located, which will in due course, begin to produce its millions of the yellow metal."

Enthusiasm is the headlight on the train of progress.

IMPORTANT CONVENTION AT THE FALLS THIS YEAR

The Technical Section of the Canadian Pulp and Paper Association is holding its summer meeting at Iroquois Falls this week. 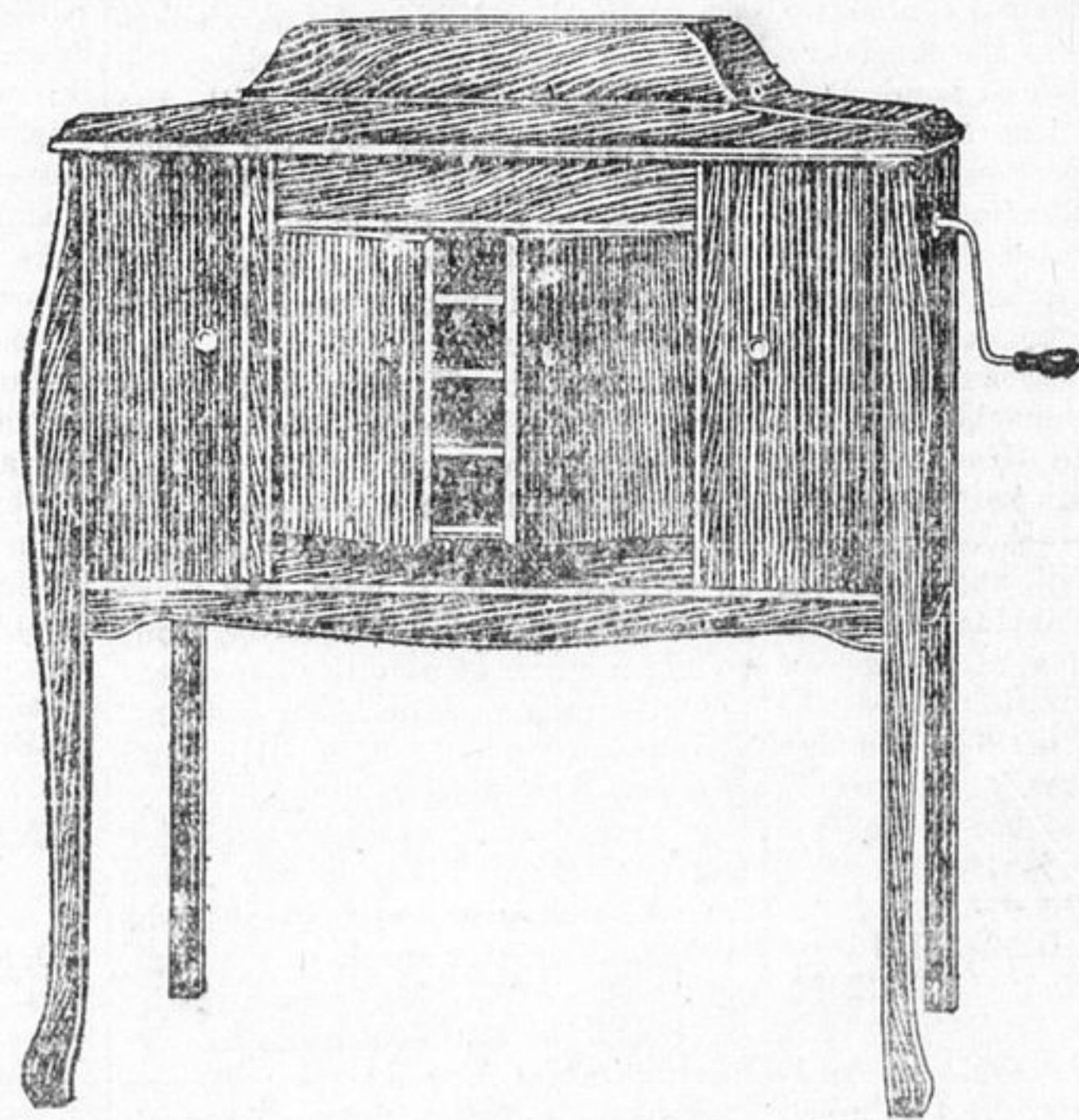
