TIMMINS WINS OPENING GAME OF DISTRICT BALL

Shuts Out Iroquois Falls Thursday With Score of 3 to 0 in Lively Game Here.

There was a big crowd on hand at the ball grounds here last Thursday afternoon for what was the first actual game in the district baseball league series. There were two previous games scheduled.—Cochrane at the Falls and Timmins at Cochrane.—but neither had been played out. The game at the Falls had to be called in the fourth innings on account of rain and the match at Cochrane was postponed on account of the weather and the T. & N. O.

The game on Thursday delighted the big crowd. It was good ball practically all the way through, with many interesting moments. Both teams put up a nice brand of ball, though the superiority of the Timmins team on the play of the day was not in much doubt. However, it must be admitted that had Pine secured the same support as given to the Timmins batsmen, the score would not have been so one-sided. Pine struck out twelve men, as against 8 by Tate. One of the special features of the day was the fine work of McIntyre behind the bat. His throws to second several times got the crowd cheering and he was right there all the time as a catcher. Jimmy Scully made a spectacular catch in the ninth that delighted the fans. There were a couple of other fine catches, one by Charlie Sheehan and the other by Geo. Lake. All through the game the Timmins boys were all on their toes and put up nice ball. Here is the game by innings:

First Innings

Falls—Bousquet struck out. Alexander out Cochrane to Farr. Becker out the same route. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Timmins—Destefano walked and stole second. Scully sacrificed him to third. Farr bunted to Pine. Cochrane out Pine to Boucher. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Second Innings

Falls—Belanger fled out to Lake. Hagan hit in front of the plate and was thrown out by McIntyre. Brydger singled through first. Bartlemess walked. Boucher's grounder forced Brydger

at third, Destefano making the out unassisted. No runs, one hit, no errors.

Timmins—Duncan struck out. Sheehan walked. Lake singled, Sheehan going to third. McIntyre grounded out to Boucher, Sheehan scoring on the play and Lake going to third. Tate struck out. One run, one hit, no errors.

Third Innings

Falls—Pine struck out. Bousquet singled. Alexander rolled to Farr who threw to second forcing Bousquet. Alexander died stealing, McIntyre to Cochrane. No runs, one hit, no errors.

Timmins—Destefano struck out. Scully grounded out to Boucher. Farr out to Pine to Boucher. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Fourth Innings

Falls—Sheehan took care of Boucher's fly. Belanger struck out. McIntyre handled Hagan's foul. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Timmins—Cochrane safe on Brydger's high throw. Duncan rolled to short who threw too late to second to get Cochrane both runners safe. Cochrane out at second, Pine to Bousquet. Sheehan doubled to deep left, Duncan scoring from first. Tate struck out. McIntyre out, Pine to Boucher. One run, one hit, one error.

Fifth Innings

Falls—Brydger struck out. Bartlemess' fly went for a triple when fielding it. Boucher rolled to Duncan who threw out Bartlemess at home. Boucher stole second. Pine fled out to Lake. No runs, one hit, no errors.

Timmins—Tate out Pine to Boucher. Destefano walked and died stealing. Scully struck out. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Sixth Innings

Falls—Bousquet out, Cochrane to Farr. Alexander struck out. Becker fled out to Sheehan. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Timmins—Farr out Bousquet to Boucher. Cochrane struck out. Duncan singled and stole second. Sheehan safe when Boucher dropped the throw Duncan going to third. Duncan scored when Alexander threw to second to get Sheehan who reached second on the throw back to the plate. Lake struck out. One run, one hit, one error.

Seventh Innings

Falls—Belanger popped to Duncan. Hagan singled and went to second on a passed ball. Brydger struck out. Bartlemess popped to Farr. No runs, one hit, no errors.

Timmins—McIntyre, Tate and Destefano struck out in a row. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Eighth Innings

Falls—Boucher safe when Farr dropped Duncan's low throw. Boucher stole second, Pine fled out to Sheehan. McIntyre's perfect peg caught Boucher asleep off second. Bousquet struck out. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Timmins—Scully and Farr struck out making Pine's sixth consecutive strike out. Cochrane walked and died stealing. No runs, no hits, no errors.

Ninth Innings

Falls—Alexander safe at first when Duncan muffed his grounder. Becker fled out to Lake. Scully handled Belanger's fly after a long run. Hagan struck out and the game was over. No runs, no hits, no errors.

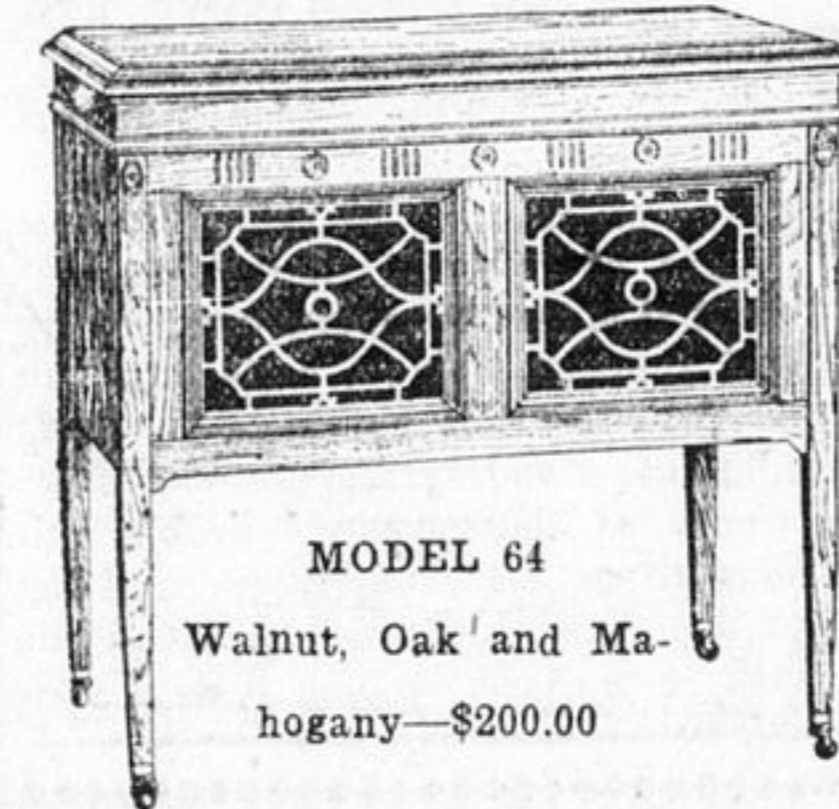
