

**IROQUOIS FALLS VIEW OF THURSDAY'S BALL GAME**

Timmins put it over 3 to 0 when the Falls journeyed there last Wednesday. In the face of the score there is no alibi, but there is no need to be down-hearted, and nobody is. Loose fielding on the part of the Falls and Timmins getting all the breaks account for the score. On the play the score should have been 1 to 0.

Pine pitched a great game and won the hearts of the Golddigger outfit. He got thirteen S.O.'s against Tait's 8. There were only three hits off Pine, four off Tait. Alexander too played a fine game, so the fault was not in the battery.

The Falls had nine men left on bases

as against Timmins' nine and had one man caught at home and a couple on third, but they could not score. Errors allowed Timmins men to crawl round the bases and the break of the hits gave them one at a time.

At bat the Falls ran in hard luck. Timmins knocked only one ball to the outfield. Falls hit a dozen to the outfield but they were badly placed with the exception of one by Bart who collected three sacks on it.

Bart made a sensational slide for home in the fourth and only McIntyre's running well out for the ball saved a score. Bart incidentally had his eye on the ball, knocking out a three bagger.

Boucher is thinking of taking a shovel to Timmins next trip. In the eighth he dove for second and made it in spite of a snappy throw, but he went so deep in the sand that he had

to be dug out. The line up Wednesday runs strongly to B's—Bousquet, Brydge, Belanger, Boucher, Bartholemew, Becker, and Bowman on the bench. The only men on the line up outside of the B's were Alexander, Hagan and Pine. The whole infield is composed of B's.

**DOMINION BANK TO BUILD NEW PREMISES ON PINE ST.**

The Dominion Bank this week is understood to have completed the purchase from Mr. Alex. Sterling of the forty-foot frontage on Pine street, opposite the post office, now occupied by Ivan Stadelman's book, stationery and music store and the Ontario Government Employment office. The sale was negotiated by Mr. H. A. Proctor. It is understood that the Dominion Bank intends to have the present buildings removed and to start work as soon as possible on a fine new bank building as premises for the local business of the Dominion Bank.

**EXPECT TRAIN THIS YEAR TO RUN NORTH OF COCHRANE**

Satisfactory progress is being made, it is said, in the work of constructing the extension of the T. & N. O. Ry. north from Cochrane to Tim Can. Grading is well under way and the steel is being shipped in. A machine for laying the steel rails is also on the way. In a week or two it is expected that the actual laying of the rails on a part of the new extension will be under way. By this fall, it is understood, the line will be all completed as far as the Abitibi Crossing and trains will be in commission to that point. It is to be hoped that the new line will be treated better in the matter of service than the paying parts of the present road. Likely it will be at first, as it will be some time before it will be a revenue producer. However, it is sincerely to be hoped that it will not be necessary to further curtail accommodation on the Porcupine Branch or other paying sections to even up matters on the whole road.

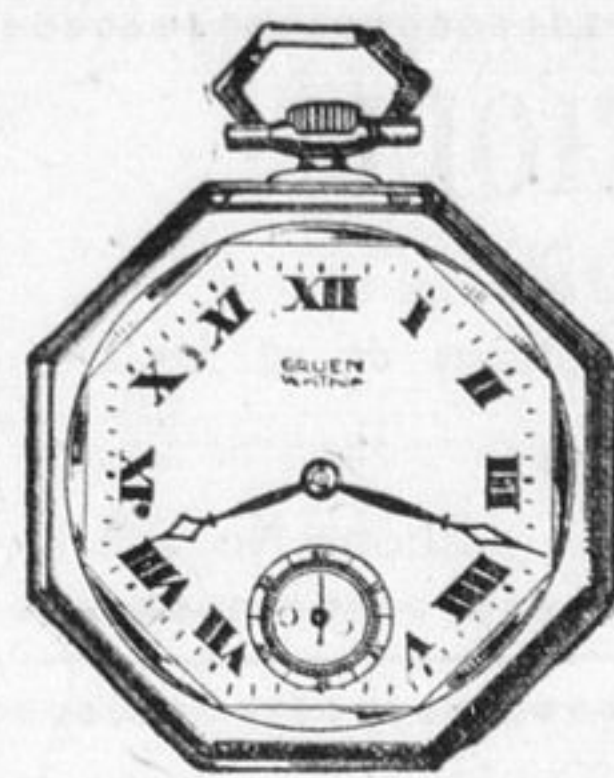
