> FAMOUS CROESUS MINE NOW BEING DE-WATERED

Advices from Matheson are to the effect that the famous Croesus Mine is being de-watered at the present time. There is no official announcement as to the intentions of the owners of the property, but the general opinion is that a resumption of operations must be in contemplation. Otherwise, why the de-watering? The Croesus has been closed down since the spring of 1918. It was generally thought then that the rich pockety vein had been lost and that efforts to pick it up had | not been successful. Many old-time mining men, however, are quite confident that the Croesus will still produce much gold, and the probable re-opening of the property will show how near they are to being right. There is said to be some broken ore in reserve at the Croesus with chances of further rich pickings. The ore from the Croesus was about as rich stuff as ever found in the North Land. Samples of this ore were exhibited all over the world and advertised the richness of North Land ore. The Croesus has produced a couple of million dollars' worth of gold it is estimated, and those knowing the property look now for more to come.




