In the last issue of The Northern News of Cobalt there is a front-page article objecting to the apparent attitude of the Ontario Government in allowing summer to slip by without anything material being done in regard to roads in the Kirkland Lake-Swastika area. The Northern News says:—"Two months of the open season is gone, and yet no definite word has been received by the Northern Development Branch at Swastika as to new road work in Temiskaming District. The reason is apparently that the Ontario Government has voted no new money to the Northern Development Fund and it is impossible to lay out a programme. The Swastika office, which has charge of all in the work in this district, is now only doing small jobs for which the money has been on hand. The delay is becoming a serious matter. The development of newer mining fields may be retarded, especially the use of large machinery. There have been rumors from time to time that certain large scale roadwork was to be done, but without definite advice and money no construction can proceed."
