From the Front and Elsewhere

Camp Borden, July 17.

Dear Geo.—
We are settled in camp and are ready for the Porcupine Advances. Our Brigade No. is the 6th and our Battalion is senior of it. The boys have settled down and everything is running smoothly. The first few days we had to make-shift for ourselves.

There are close to 32,000 men here in khaki. The review was quite a sight; the massed bands, with 900 pieces, made some noise. The weather is hot here and with the sand and no rain it makes it quite warm. The first day after we arrived they had the whole battalion cutting roads. We made a name for ourselves, as the battalion knock the bush down like beavers. We built five roads in two days, bridging the creek, corduroying the muskeg and building approaches to the steep banks. The headquarters congratulating the battalion on the work. So they may, as the city battalions were cutting their feet.

We are right there in sports and will let you know how we finish in the brigade.

If you come down this way we are in Sec. 21 and will be found easily.
