

## BREWERIES WILL SELL LIQUOR DIRECT TO THE CONSUMERS

That the Ontario breweries will not need to ship their liquor out of the province and then bring it back again before being able to make sales to Ontario people, and that the Ontario Temperance Act does not stop direct delivery of liquor from the brewery to the consumer, is the information now given. It is further learned that a test case on the matter will be taken to the highest courts in the land, and that pending this settlement, the breweries will fill all orders sent by consumers, and that the liquor will be delivered direct from the brewery to the consumer.

### What the Act Says.

The loophole which, experts say, allows the breweries to sell direct without first shipping their liquor out of the province is found in section 139 of the Ontario Temperance Act, which is the same as section 119 of the Manitoba Temperance Act. The section reads:

"While this act is intended to prohibit and shall prohibit transactions

in liquor which take place wholly within the province of Ontario, except under license or as otherwise specially provided by this act, and to restrict the consumption of liquor within the limits of the province of Ontario, it shall not affect and is not intended to affect bona fide transactions in liquor between a person in the province of Ontario and a person in another province or in a foreign country, and the provisions of this act shall be construed accordingly."

### The Main Cog.

This section refers to dealings between persons, but it does not mention the moving of liquor itself, and furthermore, it says at the bottom that "the provisions of this act shall be construed accordingly." That means that the interpretation of the whole act must depend on Sect. 139. Other provisions matter not. That is the section on which the whole question is based. The courts can decide on a test case whether that section compels the liquor men to ship their product outside the province, or whether it is only necessary that the orders for the liquor must be sent to a point outside the province, but that the liquor can be delivered from the distillery or brewery direct to the consumer.

### Will Deliver Direct.

It can be said on the best of authority that the breweries will make no attempt to ship liquor out of the province and then return it by rail. The Ontario Government intends, it is said, at the next session, to remedy the defect so that it can be made quite clear that liquor can be delivered direct from an Ontario brewery to an Ontario consumer. The breweries, pending that change, will sell direct and deliver direct to the consumers, but agencies will be established on the Quebec side where the orders can be received and returned into Ontario so as to be filled.

## \$12,000,000 SUIT FILED IN ALLEGED COPPER TRUST COMBINATION

An amended complaint has been filed in the United States District Court by Ferdinand E. M. Baillou, counsel for the United Copper Securities Company, in the damage suit against the Anaconda Copper Co., the Anaconda Copper Mining Co., Adolph Lewisohn and the other executors of Leonard Lewisohn, deceased; William Rockefeller, John W. Sterling, the Farmers' Loan and Trust Co., and Henry H. Rogers, deceased; James Stillman, the Butte Coalition Mining Co., and the Red Metals Mining Co.

As in the original complaint, the charges are a "combination and conspiracy to form a 'copper trust,'" and "to procure wrongfully the sale of the copper properties of Otto Heinze & Co." The defendants, it is charged, injured the business of Heinze & Co., tried to bribe a Montana judge and had a smelter and concentrator of the Montana Ore Purchasing Co. set on fire after the water supply had been purposely cut off. In conclusion the complaint says Otto Heinze & Co. were damaged to the amount of \$4,000,000, and under the treble damages section of the Sherman act the plaintiff seeks to recover \$12,000,000.

## ALLEGED MISREPRESENTATION BY T. EATON CO. IS BASIS FOR SUIT

The case of the Retail Merchants' Association vs. the T. Eaton Company, over alleged misrepresentation of paint sold at 33 cents a quart through the medium of their advertisements in one of the Toronto daily papers, has been adjourned on several occasions by the court at the solicitation of the interested parties, in order to give both parties an opportunity to secure expert witnesses. In the case of the T. Eaton Company, it is understood they propose bringing a witness from the United States, and in the case of the Retail Merchants Assn. the testimony of Dr. McGill, chief analyst of the Inland Revenue Department at Ottawa, will be secured.

Adjournment was taken in order to give the plaintiff and defendant an opportunity to find out the day when the services of their witnesses can be secured.

The advertisement stated that the paint in question contained only "pure lead, pure zinc, pure dry colors and pure linseed oil." The analysis of the Inland Revenue Department claimed this was not correct; hence the suit.

## Furthest North Mining Town

Not only is Longyear City the most northerly mining town, but it bids fair to become a place of importance now that a Norwegian company has taken over the vast coal fields of Spitzbergen. The enterprise is on a very large scale. The coal fields which the Norwegian company will develop cover an area of over 650 square miles, of which one-seventh has been surveyed, and it is estimated that this alone will yield something like 100,000,000 tons of coal from the first stratum, and the second stratum will probably yield as much more. There are other coal veins of which little is yet known. The enterprise is regarded as a national one, and eventually thousands of miners will be employed.
