Will Look Over Porcupine Camp

Mr. Walter R. Hensey of New York, well known since the early days of Cobalt as a successful mining operator in that district as well as Gowganda, where he is largely interested in the Bishop Silver Mines, is expected to visit the camp the latter part of the week. He will be accompanied by a party of gentlemen from Chicago and South Indiana who will inspect the principal mines in the district and also examine the properties in North Whitney being developed by the Porcupine East Lake Mining Co. These claims, six in number, are the ones that were purchased last winter by Mr. P. B. Lyon for an American syndicate. A great deal of favorable comment was created at the time by the unusually large number of free gold showings occurring on these claims, and while up to recently the work has been confined to surface trenching and stripping, the work is now being started on a more extensive scale. Permanent camp buildings are being erected, roads being constructed, and general preparations are being made for an aggressive winter's work.

Mining News

The Porcupine Lake Gold Mining Company, has started the foundation of its new power house. The size of the building will be 32x58 and will house the compressor plant as well as the boiler engines and dynamos. The work is under the supervision of Mr. Thompson. All the extensions and improvements are being made for the comfort and convenience of the management and workmen.

DISCOVERY OF PLATINUM IN ELDERADO TOWNSHIP

On The Claims of James Shea and Ore Runs \$22.75 to the Ton

Are the townships of McArthur, Eldorado and Bartlett going to make good. From the present indications there seems at least good prospecting territory in this section of the camp. From the samples of rock brought into camp by prospectors—assays made and width of veins reported, one is led to believe that there is both gold and platinum in these three townships—which lie six, twelve and eighteen miles south of Tisdale and Whitney—in paying quantities. A good assay and a rich looking sample—however does not always make a mine.

The latest discovery of platinum in this district is in Eldorado township. Eldorado corners on McArthur township, where Imerson made the big platinum find and where Lohner and Mathey made their rich gold discoveries—is immediately west of Langmuir, where the Porcupine Miracle Company has made some additional rich discoveries of gold within the past month, and is just South of Shaw and corners on Carman where C. S. Sherrill of Buffalo has been working quietly for the past year and has enough gold ore in sight to warrant the erection of a small mill.

This Eldorado platinum discovery was made on the claim of James Shea, a prospector, who has been working on the claims for the past two years. The bag of samples brought in by Mr. Shea were shown Mr. Croft Baxter, who advised an assay of rock which he selected with the result of \$22.75 in platinum and 40 cents in gold. The ore assayed was taken from across a twenty foot vein and shows some few gold.
