

## Timmins News in Brief

Mrs. W. G. Smith returned home last Saturday night after a vacation of about two months at the home of Mr. Smith in Aurora.

Mr. and Mrs. Henry A. Martin wish to announce the engagement of Mrs. Martin's sister, Miss Orilla F. Cushing, to Mr. William F. Jackson, both of Schumacher, the marriage to take place shortly.

The crowded house which was seen at the Empire last night is exemplary of the popularity of the Tom Marks Company. If you cannot take in a night performance go to the matinee to-morrow afternoon at three o'clock.

For the first time since its publication The Advance found last week that, despite increasing its numbers printed each week, there was such a demand that more copies had to be printed Saturday morning and by Monday all but a few of these were sold, they being in the Advance Office. Those patronizing the Empire Theatre regularly will be glad to learn that the management have ordered a set of new records for the electrical orchestra piano used during the shows. These number in all over a hundred and care has been taken to choose some of the very best class of music in this particular line which can be obtained.

The Timmins Fire Department ask the public to support as far as possible the show at the Empire Theatre on Wednesday night next, September 8th, when, thanks to the generosity of Mr. P. Bardesson, the proceeds will be given to the Department. The management are arranging something very special for this occasion and it is to be hoped there will be even more than the customary crowded house.

If the Overland car which the Local Red Cross Society intend placing up for competition arrives as is expected, to-morrow, there will be excellent opportunity for the public to see it for themselves on exhibition in the furniture window of Marshall-Ecclestone Ltd., at Timmins. Other sections of the gold camp will also have opportunity to see the car later, as indicated in a report in another column.

In the early hours of last Sunday morning a couple of Timmins Finlanders were noticed by Constable Roy of South Porcupine to be in that locality driving a rig and their antics were such that an investigation resulted in the discovery that they were both drunk. The result was an appearance before Mr. T. M. Wilson, J.P., at Timmins last Monday, and, including a fine of \$20 the little outing cost them each \$27.75.

The King's Amusement Parlors have been undergoing considerable improvements at the hands of Tom King recently and now it is claimed it is the largest and most up-to-date amusement place of its kind in the north country. American and English billiard tables are now installed and a regulation bowling alley. Another barber chair has been placed in, making three altogether, so that no waiting will be necessary and Mr. King has received a specially new consignment of smokers' supplies of all kinds.

Quite a large number of residents of the gold camp generally are taking their vacations at present and many of them are taking in the Canadian National Exhibition at Toronto.

Don't forget that a matinee performance will be given at the Empire Theatre to-morrow afternoon when as Tom Marks puts it "the price will be two bits to all parts of the house," commencing at three o'clock.
