

## Timmins News in Brief

Miss Annie Lalonde, who has been the guest of her sister, Mrs. T. J. Lawlor, for the past couple of months has returned to her home in Sudbury.

Through the generosity of Mr. and Mrs. Mulhern of the Goldfields Hotel, the Local Red Cross Society will now have a permanent headquarters at the Hotel, where work can be done or materials obtained at any time. It is sincerely hoped by the officials of the Local Society, therefore, that full advantage will be taken of this opportunity by all the local ladies.

It will soon be time for ratepayers of Timmins to pay their taxes and at a special meeting yesterday afternoon the Council adopted a resolution to the effect that all taxes be paid by October 25th, any not paid at that time being liable to a charge of ten per cent. extra. Mr. A. R. Globe was the mover of the motion and the seconder was Mr. E. McCoy.

The Town Solicitor of Timmins is compiling a by-law to cover compulsory early closing of the stores in compliance with a resolution passed by the Retail Merchants of Timmins (as reported in last week's Advance) and given to the Council on Wednesday. This will mean every night in the week except certain nights such as pay days, nights before holidays, etc., and there will probably be a penalty attached to the non-compliance with the by-law.

Mr. John J. Callan, who has charge of the Anglican Church at South Porcupine will preach at the Timmins Church on Sunday morning at seven o'clock. When it is remembered that a very large increase in the attendance has been noted at Southend since Mr. Callan took up duties, there should be a large assembly at the Timmins place of worship on Sunday.

The new records which the Empire Theatre have ordered to be sent forward for the grand electric orchestra have not yet come to hand contrary to expectation, but they are expected any day and patrons may anticipate something new and classic in the way of selection any time now when they pay a visit.

In a discussion by the Town Council on automobiles last Wednesday, Councillor Globe incidentally mentioned the question of drivers having to take out insurance policies. This was not for themselves, apparently, but in case of accident and injuring anyone there would be some chance of the latter being able to be recompensed. The suggestion would be well if carried out in the gold district, if only to take care of future accidents judging by the reckless driving of some in charge of cars.

The question of a speed limit in regard to automobile drivers in the gold camp has been discussed in many quarters, and the opinions expressed that the ruling bodies of the whole district should take some steps to control this particular source of danger. There have been instances cited within the past few months where some very narrow escapes have been witnessed not only regarding drivers themselves but also drivers of other vehicles and pedestrians. As the matter stood it seemed as if the local police authorities' hands were tied in the matter through not having any law by which they could take action except probably in cases where very clear proof was shown of reckless and dangerous driving. With the increase of autos coming to the gold camp it certainly seems expedient that those holding licenses should be under some control.

Mr. M. J. Roche, the well known local jeweler and also of Cochrane, arrived on his usual business visit in the gold camp this morning.

Councillor Chas. Dalton left on the noon train to-day for a six weeks visit to the Exposition at San Francisco and other places in that part of the country.

In addition to the long list of Italian reservists who left Timmins last Friday as given in the Advance there were over thirty left Saturday but even their compatriots staying behind were unable to hand a list to the Advance on this occasion.

Master Edward Tripp of Schumacher has gone to attend the American International College of Springfield, Mass. He leaves a large circle of friends in the gold camp and is extended the very best wishes of these in his studies.

An interesting exhibit in the window of M. J. Roche at Timmins is the handsome trophy which Mr. E. G. Dickson presented for competition in the Porcupine Football League. For the first occasion since it was put up Timmins are the winners as indicated by the inscription on the cup.

The Voters' List for the Town of Timmins has been completed and was printed by the Porcupine Advance this week, preliminary copies being handed to the various members of the Council by Town Clerk Montgomery and also sending the necessary other copies to proper quarters in compliance with Municipal By-laws. As soon as everything is passed and approved the necessary number will be in the hands of the Town Clerk for distribution.

The service in the Empire Theatre for the Presbyterian congregation will again be conducted on Sunday evening at seven o'clock by Mr. Noseworthy, the student from Schumacher. Mr. J. M. Allan, the pastor in charge was expected back from his vacation this week end but a telegram from him gives the indication that he will not return until some time next week.

Mr. Roy Dixon, of Chas. A. See's Drug Store, leaves the camp permanently on the noon train to-morrow to take a position with the Canadian Consolidated Rubber Co. at Toronto. Having been here since April last Mr. Dixon has made quite a large circle of friends who will wish him every success in his new sphere.

Ellis and Mrs. Joseph Mills will entertain at a tea for the Ladies' Guild of the Anglican Church of Timmins, at the home of Mrs. Ellis on Spruce Street, on Thursday next the 16th, from three to five o'clock in the afternoon. All members of the Guild and their friends are cordially invited and urged to attend.

Secretary F. C. H. Simms yesterday sent out notices for a meeting of the Board of Trade at Timmins. In case any who are members did not receive these up to time of the issue of The Advance they are specially requested, on seeing this notice, to be sure and attend the meeting in the Town Council Chamber at 8 o'clock.

Something out of the ordinary and yet of much interest at the present time in the way of window displays is that of J. P. McLaughlin at Timmins, who is featuring Home Guard uniforms. These are of a khaki color and at first the impression was created that they were for the local training corps. So far, however, this has not been decided upon but the appearance of the uniforms would add materially to interest in Home Guards of the gold camp.

Many local housekeepers who wished to secure goods at certain stores of the town on Thursday and yesterday would wonder why they were closed and in explanation it might be said that if the owners were Jews they were celebrating the Jewish New Year on these two days, although one or two did not mark the occasion by closing. On Saturday next the 18th, however, the strict observance of the Hebrew Holy Day will be observed by every Jew in both this and all other parts of the world and accordingly local stores will be closed including Chas. Pierce and Sons, at Timmins.
