## TEMPERANCE WORKERS PLAN CAMPAIGN

Want Local Option in Fifty More Places in Ontario at Next Election

The Ontario branch of the Dominion Alliance has definitely decided to introduce local option campaigns this year in some fifty Ontario municipalities, more than half of which are large-sized towns and cities, including Peterboro, St. Mary's, Wingham, Clinton, Essex and Parkhill.

The Province has been divided into six parts, and Field Secretaries will be kept busy from now until January 1 organizing committees and arranging for the introduction of by-laws for the suppression of the liquor traffic. Some of the municipalities which will be tried this year have been unsuccessfully contested before, but the outlook is regarded as most favorable for the passing of by-laws next January.

## Long Hat Pins A Public Menace

Word comes from London that the Manchester corporation has taken steps to minimize the risks associated with the wearing of large hat pins. The tramways committee has placed notices in the tram cars, calling attention of women passengers to the danger of other passengers from the practice of wearing unprotected hat pins. The corporation officials hope that the mere posting of the notices will be sufficient.

Wood's speed bothered the Giants particularly in the latter part of the game.
