GREAT FINANCIERS AGAINST WAR

Peace Will Be Mantained For Commercial Reasons and Not Humanitarian

Discussing the monetary aspect of the Balkan trouble. Henry Clewes, the New York banker, says :

Financial influences are ineviatably coming to be the controlling factor this war. In these days war is chiefly a matter of finance, and the allies opposing Turkey cannot continue indefinately a loss of a million dollars per day, the present estimated cost of the war.
