THE "BROKEN COIN" SERIAL WILL BE MISSED TWO WEEKS

Censors Condemn 14th and 15th Episodes Because of Pictures Showing the War in Detail

The Management of the Empire Theatre regret to inform their patrons who have been following the pictorial story of the "Broken Coin" that in a letter dated October 27th from the Universal Film Company, they state that the fourteenth and fifteenth episodes have been condemned by the Censors on account of the very life-like representation of the war between the Balkans.

The result of this, over which of course the Empire Management have absolutely no control, is that the sixteenth episode will not be shown until two weeks from Wednesday, November 3rd.

The subsequent pictures of "The Broken Coin" are being so arranged by the producers that the story will not be interfered with in any way and the great interest now aroused will be maintained.

The date of the next episode of "The Broken Coin" therefore will be Wednesday, November 17th, when the exciting experiences of Kitty Grey will be resumed in such a way that this restriction by the Censors will have no material effect on the outcome.
