One of the first Chinese babies to die in Timmins passed away from pneumonia on Monday morning at the age of eight months. The infant was Baby Hong, whose parents conduct the dairy just outside the town limits. Interment was made at South Porcupine.

At noon on Sunday the firemen had another call and gave another speedy response, only to find that the alarm was a false one. It is thought that the alarm was caused by the touching of the wires somewhere on the circuit, as the glass on the alarm box was found unbroken and the box had not been tampered with.

Another hearing will be given to the enquiry by the Railway and Municipal Board into the telephone rates and tolls in the Township of Tisdale. This hearing will be held in Toronto some time this month. In the meantime a valuation of the whole system is to be made by an expert with a view to an adjustment of the rates if such seems necessary.

A corporal for a French-Canadian battalion signed up two men here on Saturday, and later the men claimed they were not provided with either bed or board. Chief Kraft interviewed the corporal, only to be told that he had no authority for such expenditures. Later it developed that both men had been rejected by one doctor, though another had first passed one of them. Chief Kraft gave the men accommodation over Sunday and secured a position for them with a farmer of the district on Monday morning.
