CANADA RICH IN COAL SAYS MINING PAPER

Governments and Railways Should Help the People in the Matter of Fuel.

In an editorial in the last issue of The Mining and Engineering Record of Vancouver, B.C., the question of Canada's position in the matter of fuel supply is touched upon. The editorial says:—"The shortage of coal in Eastern Canada and the consequent suffering is discreditable to the powers that be. The University of Toronto had to close and the beautiful trees of the Sunnyside Orphanage had to be cut down to provide fuel. Canada is one of the richest countries in the world in coal; yet the provinces of Manitoba, Ontario and Quebec have insisted on depending on imports of fuel from Pennsylvania. With a railway tariff designed to promote east and west traffic, supplemented by a summer freight service on the Saskatchewan River, there is no reason why sufficient fuel should not be shipped from Alberta and Saskatchewan during the summer months to provide the winter supply for these provinces. The lignites and the lower grade coals could be utilized in by-product plants to supply gas for heating and domestic purposes at economic cost. The Dominion and Provincial governments have provided immense subsidies in land and money to build the transcontinental railways, and in return these railways should be expected to give rates favorable to east and west-bound traffic in preference to north-south business. The condition suggests administrative negligence in competence.

Harry Yates, formerly of New Liskeard, and brother of Mr. W. J. Yates of that town, was instantly killed in a recent explosion in a Sudbury mine where he was working. A widow and three small children survive.
