THE GLORY STILL KEEPS UP AT THE POLICE COURT

If the police keep on in this town a man won't be able to do anything but behave himself or pay the penalty. Even the ladies are not immune from the law and its regulations. For this week's police court, Constable Greer has a charge against Mary Klemp for having liquor illegally in a public place. When the Constable and Chief Clark and Provincial Officer Aekroyd visited Mary the other evening they found liquor and a drunk man or two. Sam Woreschuck, an Austrian, was one of the drunk men there, and Constable Greer has a charge against Sam for that offence. Mary says Sam brought the liquor to the house, but Sam says he bought it there. The Magistrate will decide. Chief Clark also got a charge from the case, as Sam, though an Austrian, had not reported. Constable Greer also picked up T. Musik for being drunk Saturday evening and Musik will face the music on Thursday.

Provincial Officer Aekroyd has also been having some exercise. He picked up R. Pressio for being drunk, and Pressio put up a fight—for a very short time. On searching Pressio's room at the Windsor a bottle of gin was found, and as Pressio says the proprietor was assisting in its consumption, Louis Gowin will also face a charge of having liquor in a public place. Lorenzo Candello was taken in charge by the Provincial for being drunk, while C. Alexandro faces a double charge—being drunk and indecent exposure. He was also an ugly customer and the big Provincial simply called a lorry, threw him on it and sat on him to keep him from falling off until the station was reached.

Canada's Victory Loan

\$150,000,000 5 1/2% Gold Bonds

Bearer or Registered Bonds

Bonds may be registered as to principal or as to principal and interest. Scrip certificates, non-negotiable, or payable to bearer, in accordance with the choice of the applicant for registered or bearer bonds, will be issued after allotment in exchange for provisional receipts. When these scrip certificates have been paid in full, and payment endorsed thereon by the bank receiving the money they may be exchanged for bonds, when prepared, with coupons attached, payable to bearer, or registered as to principal, or for fully registered bonds when prepared, without coupons, in accordance with the application.

Delivery of interim certificates and of definitive bonds will be made through the Chartered Banks. Bearer bonds with coupons will be issued in denominations of \$50, \$100, \$500, and \$1,000, and may be registered as to principal only. Fully registered bonds, the interest on which is paid direct to the owner by Government cheque, will be issued in denominations of \$1,000, \$5,000, or any authorized multiple of \$5,000.

Subject to the payment of 25 cents for each new bond issued, holders of fully registered bonds without coupons, will have the right to convert into bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 with coupons, and holders of bearer bonds will have the right to convert into fully registered bonds of authorized denominations without coupons, at any time, on application to the Minister of Finance.

Holders of Dominion of Canada Debenture Stock, due October 1st, 1919, and bonds of the three preceding Dominion of Canada War Loan Issues, have the privilege of surrendering their bonds in part payment for subscriptions to bonds of this issue, under the following conditions:—

- Debenture Stock, due October 1st, 1919, at Par and Accrued Interest.
- War Loan Bonds, due December 1st, 1922, at 97 1/2% and Accrued Interest.
- (The above will be accepted in part payment for bonds of any of the three maturities of this Issue)
- War Loan Bonds, due October 1st, 1931, at 97 1/2% and Accrued Interest.
