MERCHANDISING COMPANY BRIEFS.

The Food Controller has extended the time for selling package Cereals to January 31st for retailers. After that date all cereals must be sold in bulk and cannot be purchased from the wholesaler in less than twenty pound packages.

THE EXEMPTION BOARD

Messrs. S. G. McCoubrey and A. J. Hodgins, with Mr. R. S. Potter as the Military Representative, have been sitting at the Court House since the 8th instant as a Local Exemption Tribunal for hearing exemption applications under the Military Service Act. Mr. R. J. Hart was also appointed as interpreter.

The work is averaging about 25 cases per day, and from information received from the Tribunal we learn that the real cases for exemption are trifling. Men in the "A" Class almost invariably have very valiant reasons for wishing to be exempted. They also state that it is not fair to call every young fellow a slacker who is not in khaki; for, as a matter of fact one or more of the boys in town, should their case be known and proven, as it has been to the Exemption Board, deserve at least the Military Cross. The real slacker, however, is being sent forward without any strings attached to him.

Tenders will be received by the undersigned up to and including the seventeenth day of December next for the right to cut pulpwood and pine timber on a certain area situated in the vicinity of the Kapuskasing River in the Districts of Timiskaming and Algoma.

Tenders are to offer a flat rate per cord for all classes of pulpwood, whether spruce or other woods. The successful tenderer shall be required to pay for the Red and White Pine on the limit a flat rate of \$10 per thousand and feet board measure.

The successful tenderer shall also be required to erect a mill or mills on or near the territory, and to manufacture the wood into pulp and paper in the Province of Ontario, in accordance with the terms and conditions of sale which can be had on application to the Department.

Parties making tender will be required to deposit with their tender a marked cheque payable to the Honourable the Treasurer of the Province of Ontario, for Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), which amount will be forfeited in the event of their not entering into agreement to carry out conditions, etc. The said Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) will be held by the Department until such time as the terms and conditions of the agreement to be entered into have been complied with and the said mills erected, equipped and in operation. The said sum may then be applied in such amounts and at such times as the Minister of Lands, Forests and Mines may direct in payment of accounts for dues or any other obligation due the Crown until the whole sum has been applied.

The highest or any tender not necessarily accepted.
