

'Messrs. S. G. McCoubrey and A. J. Hodgins, with Mr. R. S. Potter as the Military Representative, have been sitting at the Court House since the 8th instant as a Local Exemption Tribunal for hearing exemption applications under the Military Service Act. Mr. R. J. Hart was also appointed as interpreter.
