JOHN ROSS, OUR PAPER MILL SUPERINTENDENT INSTANTLY KILLED

(From The Broke Hustler)
A fatal and regrettable accident occurred at the mill of the Abitibi Power & Paper Company on Saturday, December 8th, at 10:30 a.m., when John Ross, our General Superintendent, was caught in the rope transmission of Number One Paper Machine and instantly killed.

The late Mr. Ross was forty-five years of age, was conceded by all who knew him to be the Dean of all Paper Makers and was the highest paid man in his line in America.

The workmen at the Mill paid high tribute to his worth when they met Saturday evening and passed resolutions expressing their highest appreciation of Mr. Ross and a wish that they be allowed to take charge of the arrangements for his funeral.

Services were omitted at all the other churches on Sunday morning so that everyone might have the opportunity of attending the Solemn High Mass offered for the repose of his soul at the Roman Catholic Church. The office of the dead was sung over the remains at the Church on Sunday afternoon.

The remains left Iroquois Falls, in charge of friends Monday morning for Portland, Maine, where interment took place on Wednesday.
