next corner. It was below the ground and practically buried. The matter was referred to the Board of Works. The Mayor also enquired as to the possibility of putting in crossings at such points as the Goldfields, Dalton's, etc., where they were badly needed.

The matter of the backyards was brought to the attention of Council by the Mayor. Although much had been done this year, there still remained much in the backyards that might be considered unsanitary and a fire menace. There were old boxes, log piles, old sleighs, shafts, etc. The Mayor thought a stern cleaning-up was needed. He referred to a case one year at Gowganda where the sanitary inspector had courteously given a short, but reasonable time for cleaning-up and then no excuse was accepted. All who had not cleaned up were promptly fined. Only similar procedure, the Mayor thought, would do the work here. Councillor Brazeau suggested that ratepayers be asked to rake up the stones, etc., in front of their places and that the town remove the piles on a given day. Other suggestions as to cleaning up the town were considered, but nothing definite announced.

The requirements submitted by the Fire Chief were ordered to be secured. Accounts for salaries, supplies, etc., were passed and ordered paid.

For the convenience of residents on Third Avenue, it was decided to run a two-inch pipe from Second Avenue across to Third Avenue to supply water in the summer for domestic use.

On motion of Councillors Brazeau and McInnis it was decided to purchase four barrels of oil to experiment with the oiling of the roads here, the town to pay half the cost of the oil.

The matter of having a by-law requiring a fee from all outside auctioneers was discussed, and a by-law to this effect will be drafted.

A by-law regarding the scavenging work of the town was given its first two readings, and then held over for the adjustments of rates, etc., before receiving its third reading.

The population of Sudbury is now 7,216, an increase of 174 over last year, according to the town's assessment roll for 1918.

OWING to the seriousness of the fuel situation at the present time, the Government of Ontario would urge upon all the farmers or others who may have wood lots, to assist at this time by making provision for their fuel supply from such lots.

The Government would also draw the attention of the various Municipalities throughout the Province to the necessity of taking some Municipal action to secure fuel supply. To this end the Government has decided to issue to any Municipality in Ontario a permit to cut fire wood in Algonquin Park or from other Crown Lands free of charge.
