Mr. J. Byek, of Byek & Blakey, was among those listed last week as among those ill with influenza, but this week he is recovered enough to be around as usual.

Mr. J. Gurnell returned last week from Toronto, to which city he was called by the illness of his brother. His brother was one of the sufferers from the prevalent influenza, but was recovered beyond the danger point before Mr. Gurnell left the city to return here.

Last week Mr. D. A. Hoggarth received some interesting war souvenirs from his son who has been overseas since the early part of the war. One of the souvenirs is a German helmet, another a German water bag, and a third a sand bag used by the Germans. Another very interesting souvenir is a Hun belt. On the metal buckle of the belt is the die-stamped inscription:—"Gott Mit Uns."

All will regret to learn that Pte. Alex. B. Ramsay, of Timmins, who has been overseas for some time, is in hospital in France suffering from the effects of one of the German gas attacks. All wish for him a speedy and complete recovery. With the war apparently ended now so far as the actual fighting is concerned, it seems particularly hard that those who have gone through so much should suffer at the last moment as it were. But there is at least this comfort—that soon the reporting of men wounded, in hospital, etc., will be unnecessary, and there will be no casualty list.

All in Timmins were delighted this week to see Miss Burke able to be out again after her recent illness. Miss Burke was among the very first of the volunteer nurses giving such excellent service under the most trying conditions in the early stages of the Influenza epidemic here. In her devotion to her nursing duties she overtaxed her strength and some days ago was taken ill. Because of her unselfish and helpful service in a time of need, the public generally will be specially interested and pleased to know that she is making rapid and complete recovery.
