COCHRANE MAY BE DEMOBILIZATION CENTRE.

Last week a representative of the Dominion Government visited Cochrane to find accommodation for about 250 soldiers, it being the intention of the authorities to use Cochrane as one of the demobilization centres from which to place the returned soldiers in civil occupations. Cochrane was chosen on account of the plan of the Government to encourage the soldiers to settle in the North Land, and Cochrane was considered the natural available centre for distributing the soldiers under the plans made. It is expected that the demobilization will take almost two years and Cochrane would need to furnish accommodation for a number of soldiers during that time. On account of the 1916 fire Cochrane has no buildings suitable for the housing of so large a force of men, but the Council, the Board of Trade and other interests are working now to secure Government aid to erect proper quarters and have Cochrane as one of the demobilization centres. A delegate was sent to Ottawa last week with this end in view.

OPTION ON ANCHORITE DROPPED BY CONIAGAS

The option held by the Coniagas Company of Cobalt ran out on November 30th, and before that date had been reached the Company had cleared its men and equipment from the property. The equipment was taken last week to the Maidens-McDonald property which is owned by the Coniagas, and it is understood that work on the Maidens-McDonald claim will be prosecuted with much vigor. There is little information as to the reason for the dropping of the option on the Anchorite. There is a general idea that recent developments on the Anchorite showed great promise, and a number of promising finds were reported from the property recently. There may be other reason than lack of confidence in the property to cause the dropping of the option. In the meantime, however, there is considerable activity in regard to the Maidens-McDonald and many are of the opinion that there will be interesting developments in the very near future.

TORONTO BOLSHEVIKI WOULD "WADE IN BLOOD."

Dominion officers here are on the lookout for a certain brand of vicious Bolsheviki circular recently distributed in Toronto. About 20,000 of these circulars were sent around Toronto a week or more ago, chiefly to laborers and returned soldiers. "Wade in blood up to the knees, if necessary," and "Arise and seize what is yours," are sample sentences from this revolutionary pamphlet. The people are advised to upset the law and all government, and Russia is actually held up as a model. The circular seems like the product of a madman, but it has the support and sympathy of the Bolsheviki element in the city. When Inspector Kennedy was asked by The Toronto News what he was doing about the matter, he answered, "What is the use of doing anything at all, when the courts refuse to exercise restraint upon these people." Up here, however, the police are not so handicapped. At the last court twelve aliens were punished by Magistrate Atkinson for having objectionable literature. Every citizen who has considered the question recognizes that the ungrateful and vicious agitation of these aliens must be suppressed, and the pity is that some judges seem to either not know or not care as to the interests of law and order and the country's good.
