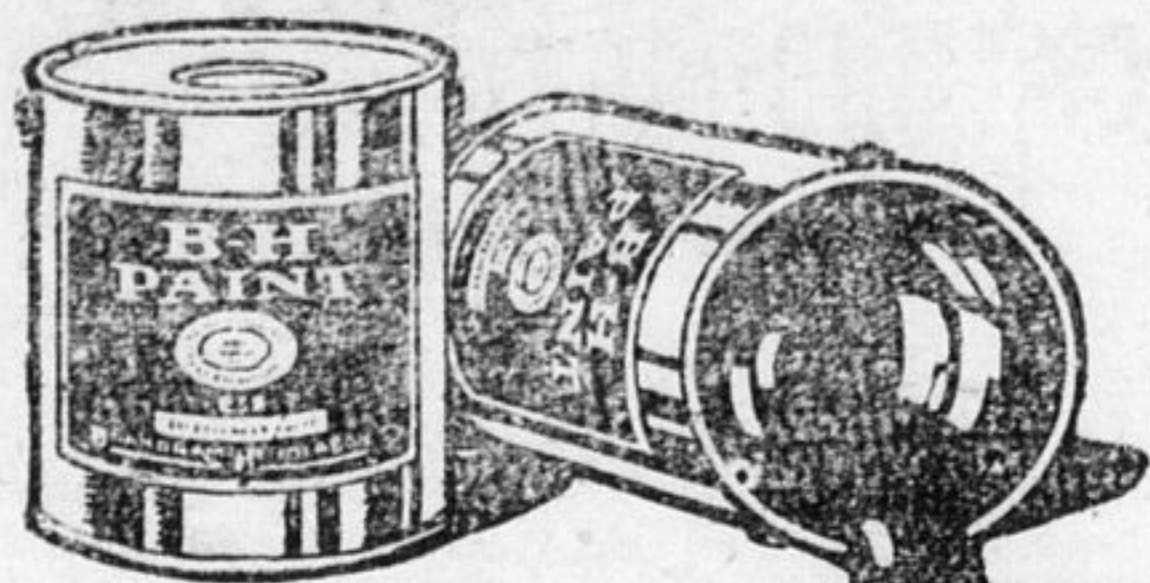

**RETURNED SOLDIER  
RESCUED FROM POLICE**

Other Returned Soldiers Enforce Fair Deal for a Returned Man.

Word reached here last week of an interesting episode last Thursday at Englehart. According to the best obtainable summary of the stories told, the Provincial Officer at Englehart, took a returning soldier off the train with the idea of locking him up in the jail. The soldier was asleep when the officer came into the coach and woke him up and let him understand he was to be arrested. There does not seem to be any clear idea as to why the soldier was to be jailed. The common opinion is that he had a bottle of liquor with him and so was being "pinned" for an infraction of the O.T.A. In any event, other returned soldiers at Englehart and some of the other good citizens of the town took an active interest in the arrest, and a rescue party was organized. The returned soldier was forcibly freed from the unwelcome police protection and sent joyfully on his way again. The Provincial Officer then attempted to have summonses issued against the men taking part in the rescue work, but the Magistrate refused to issue them, and the people of the town and district gave hearty approval of this. It is understood that the whole affair has been now dropped by all concerned, though there is still some ill-feeling at the idea of a returned soldier being molested for an infraction of the O.T.A., when that infraction was no more serious than the possession of a bottle in a public place.
