TWO NEIGHBORLY MEN
GIVEN THE "HORSE LAUGH"

While Messrs Tomlinson and Anderson, of the Dominion Police stationed here, were returning one evening last week from South Porcupine they noticed a horse and buggy coming along the road without any driver in the rig. The driverless horse was coming along at a rapid rate, and the two men agreed that there was every chance of the runaway damaging the buggy, the harness and itself, unless it was stopped. Before the men had finished their long tramp here, the two horses had safely arrived at their own stables, unhurt, and with no injury done to the harness or the rigs.

REGULAR BIG STEAMBOAT
SERVICE FOR HURRICANAW

The Hurricanaw Mining Camp, reached now by way of Amos Quebec, is more important than generally realized. The district has not, perhaps, been boomed after the manner of many new mining districts, but there has been a quiet but noteworthy interest shown in it that gives promise of big things in the future. During the past month or two there has been decided activity in the district, with still brighter promise for the future. A number of properties have recently been optioned, the total purchase price for four of them running over \$2,000,000.00. Another evidence of the importance of the Camp is suggested by the fact that the Amos Navigation Company, Limited, has been organized with ample capital and are placing two steamboats on the Hurricanaw River to give a regular summer service from Amos to Lake Kaniwick. This will give regular and convenient access to the gold mining district, including the Martin Gold Mines, the Ciseo and other properties, as well as to the St. Maurice and Benjamin Molybdenite mines. The St. Maurice Molybdenite mines will have their mill going by June 15th and the pro-

spects for this property seem assured. There will be a regular mail. The steamboat service will be run on all summer, while there is also ample provision for the handling of all freight required. The Amos Navigation Company service should certainly give a decided boom to the opening up and development of the Hurricanaw district, in which many Timmins people are interested.

Mr. Chas. Cummings, who has been spending the winter in Ottawa, returned last week to the Camp here for a visit. He intends to go out to the Pas, Manitoba, next month, as he is scheduled to leave early in June with a prospecting party for the large English syndicate represented in Manitoba by Mr. H. M. Paull, formerly of Timmins.

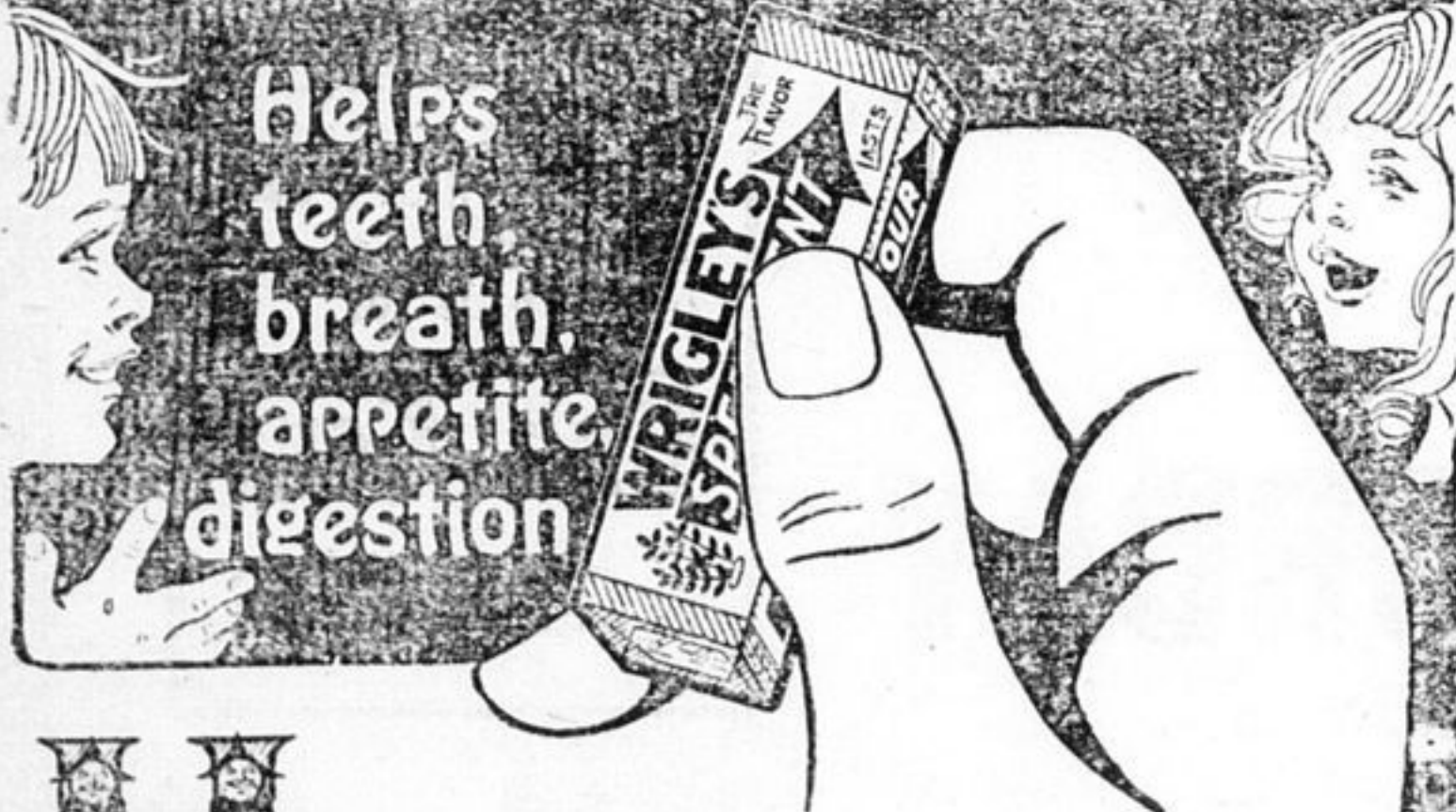
