DISTRICT VOCATIONAL
OFFICER AT HAILEYBURY

Mr. Alex. H. Smith, one of the officers who recruited for the Second Pioneers in Timmins, has been appointed District Vocational Officer of the Department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment for the Northern District, and has opened up offices in the Wright Building, Main Street, Haileybury. This office will give special attention to the cases of all disabled men and minors. By "minors" is meant all those who joined the colors before the age of eighteen. Any disabled soldier or minor wishing to take advantage of the aid given by the Vocational Branch can apply to Mr. Smith and will get every assistance possible. This new office will help men in need of this assistance to get it quickly and without the necessity of applying to Ottawa or Toronto. Courses covering all kinds of subjects such as Mining and Milling, Telegraphy, Business College courses, Garment Making, etc., are open to the disabled men and minors. The district under the charge of Mr. Smith is from North Bay, North to Cochrane, and along the Transcontinental east and west.

GIRLS' BASEBALL TEAM PLAY SCHUMACHER AGAIN

The Timmins Girls' Baseball team went over to Schumacher on Monday for a game with the young ladies of that town. Schumacher had a picked team for the occasion, but did not get ready for play until 8.15, and as a consequence the game had to be called on account of the darkness before all the innings were played. The score when the game was called was 11 to 10 in favor of Schumacher, but the Timmins young ladies are quite confident they could have won again if the game had been played out. The battery for Timmins was Miss Lillian McCarthy and Miss Carmel Costello, Miss Nellie Edwards, of North Bay, also pitching for a short time, but Miss McCarthy returning as pitcher to hold down the bases on balls. The other players for Timmins were:—Misses Mary Daher, shortstop; Nora Kennedy, left field; Nellie Edwards, right field; Fern McCarthy, centre field. For Schumacher Miss Henrietta Plannit pitched the most of the game, Mrs. Parker relieving her towards the end of the game. Miss Laura Bergeron was catcher for Schumacher. Messrs W. Navarre and C. Burns umpired the game. The girls put up a lively and interesting game of ball and some good play in pitching, batting, base-stealing and in catching featured the work of both teams.

TIMMINS AND PORCUPINE- DOME TIE AT FOOTBALL

One of the fastest and most closely contested games of the season was the football match on Wednesday evening last on the Athletic Grounds here between Timmins and Porcupine-Dome teams. Both were out to win and the play was fast throughout, yet it was a clean, gentlemanly game, without roughness or "crabbing." One of the features of the game was the run of fine shots made by Twaddle, only the steady work of the South Porcupine goal tender saving a larger score. Timmins seemed to have the best of the play to a certain extent throughout the game, but despite the most strenuous efforts it was impossible for either side to break the tie which concluded the game, 3 to 3. Hallowell in goal made his usual good record of saves, while Andy Roberts was also a strong element in the game. W. Field played a lively and untiring game and did good work for the team, while the rest of the Timmins team also worked hard for victory. Porcupine-Dome also had a good line-up, the work of Harrower and Hendry being particularly effective though all played fast and skilfully. The Timmins line-up was:—Hallowell, Roberts, Shaw, Field, Carr, Houle, White, Jemmett, Pate, Collins and Twaddle. The South End team included:—Hendry, Black, Sweet, Harrower, Crantley, Nicholson, Ewart, Woods, Seager.

Mr. T. McCluskey refereed the game in able manner. One old-time football player classed him as "one of the best referees ever judging a

game in the North Land." There was a good turn-out for the game and interest was maintained from beginning to end. This tie game will count as a point each for the two teams, in the competition for the Dickson Cup.

COMMITTEE EXPLAIN POSITION RE CLUB HOUSE

With reference to the resolution passed at a recent G. W. V. A. meeting, and which appeared in the issue of The Advance under date Aug 13th, the committee appointed by, and on behalf of the G. W. V. A., wish to make a thorough explanation to the Public, as this item seems to have created an absolute contradictory impression.

The funds now being raised by a committee of the citizens of the Town of Timmins is for the purpose of erecting a Memorial Club for the use of the Veterans of The Great War.

As soon as sufficient funds have been raised, a building will be erected suitable for their purposes, and as soon as completed will be placed under the management of the G. W. V. A. and continue so as long as required by them.

The deed of said building will be held by trustees in order that the building may, in course of time, revert to the Town instead of passing into the control of the Central Organization in case the G. W. V. A. or Veterans of this district should no longer require its use.

Trusting that this explanation will remove the difficulties with which the Committee in charge of raising the fund have met owing to this resolution and which, unfortunately caused considerable misunderstanding; and assuring the Public that any assistance and support they render the committee formed for raising the funds sufficient for the Memorial Club Building will be greatly appreciated by not only the members of the Goldfields Branch of the G. W. V. A., but all Veterans of The Great War.

For the Timmins team the pitchers were "Lefty" Parr, D. McInnis and "Jimmy" Deacon, with W. McIntyre behind the bat. J. Monaghan umpired, with E. H. Rutherford on bases.

The lacrosse match on the Athletic Grounds here last night between Timmins and McIntyre proved a very speedy and interesting match with honors for the two teams fairly even, as the score of 7 to 6 would suggest.
