PORCUPINE HOCKEY TEAM

was felt by the meeting that the attitude here in regard to the League would depend considerably upon Iroquois Falls. If Iroquois Falls entered the League, a team or teams from the Porcupine could play in a Northern Group with the Falls. Otherwise, the team here could play with the Central Group. Mr. Briden, of Schumacher, said that they expected to have a good McIntyre team and enter it in the League. He had interviewed Mr. Ennis about the matter and Mr. Ennis had promised fullest support, except that he would not encourage professionalism in any way. Mr. Briden understood it was the intention to have an open air rink at the McIntyre this year for skating and hockey practice. According to O.H.A. rules games would. have to be played in the nearest covered rink, and this rule would apply to both Iroquois Falls and McIntyre if they entered the League. The general feeling of the meeting was that it would be best to have one team from the Porcupine in the N.O. H.A., particularly if it were necessary to play in the Central Group. The matter of the local league was decided by the following motion:-"Moved by W. Wylie, seconded by S. McCoy, and carried, That a local league be formed of the Hollinger. McIntyre, and a Town Team." The residence rule of Nov. 1st will apply to the players in this local league, and a list of players is to be submitted at a meeting called for Oct. 17th. In cases where a man worked, say at the Hollinger, and lived at Schumacher, or whether he worked at the Hollinger and lived in Timmins, thus being eligible to play in either team, it was thought that the best way would be to let the player himself choose in which team he would play.

The matter of the entering the Norther Ontario Hockey Association was decided by motions by Messrs. Wylie and Lowe, to the effect that in case of Iroquois Falls joinling the League we enter a team in the Northern Ontario Hockey Association to be grouped with Iroquois Falls, and in case Iroquois Falls does not enter that we accept grouping with the Central Group.

On motion of Messrs. Briden and Sullivan, of Schumacher, the team to be entered in the N.O.H.A. will be known as the Porcupine Hockey

On motion of Messrs. W. Wylie and G. S. Drew, it was unanimously decided that Mr. G. S. Lowe be the representative from here on the executive of the N.O.H.A.

After a general discussion on hockey matters and prospects, the meeting adjourned.

VICTORY LOAN CAMPAIGN OPENS ON MONDAY NEXT

Campaign to Obtain Three Hundred Millions Soon Under Way.

The campaign sheets sent out by the Canadian Press Association for the 1919 Victory Loan announce Monday next as the day that the 1919 Victory Loan opens. They also take occasion to point out that, "Be sure you don't start anything you can't finish," is good advice for anyone; if it is good for them individually it is good for hem collectively; it is good for Canada. Canada entered the war determined to see it through. The war is over, but the results of the war are not over yet. It is up to Canada to stay with the game until the affair is all over, and the last light out. The aftermath of the war includes obligations to soldiers and the dependents of the fallen. These are debts that cannot be left unpaid. The wounded man in the hospitals look to Canada for health again. The crippled veteran expects that Canada will see that he can earn his living well, in spite of his handicap. In addition Canada needs money for working capital, as it were. On Monday the Victory Loan 1919 opens. By this means Canada expects to get the needed money to carry on until these results of the war are wiped out. It is expected that every citizen will see to t that this last and final loan is a complete success.

KIPPAWA FIBRE PLANT NEARING COMPLETION

The big \$4,000,000.00 plant of the Kippawa Fibre Company, a subsifew weeks the power development is being rushed to completion at South Temiskaming, at the foot of Lake Temiskaming. With the exception of the bleaching plant, the construction work is practically all completed and the work of installing the machinery is now proceeding. It is learned that the mill is expected to turn out upwards of 25,000 tons of bleached sulphite pulp during 1920.. In a few weeks the power development ie expected to be completed, followed by the immediate operation of the whole plant.


