**SEVENTY-FIVE WEEKLY  
FOUND EMPLOYMENT HERE**

Record of Local Government  
Employment Office.

An average of about seventy-five men each week are now provided with suitable employment through the good offices of the Timmins branch of the Government Employment Bureaux. The majority of the men thus looked after by the local branch of the Government Employment Bureaux are returned soldiers, but the good work of the office is not confined to soldiers. Others desiring employment may also take advantage of the offices here, and there is absolutely no fee or charge of any kind. The Government Employment Bureaux not only give a free service, but it may also be noted with satisfaction that the treatment given to those seeking employment and those desiring men alike is much superior in every way to the attitude of the old style of employment agencies.

The Government Employment Bureaux have branches in leading centres from Halifax to Vancouver. By a well-planned system of daily bulletins, now working smoothly and effectively, the wants of each office are made known to each of the others. If there is a man here desiring employment in some particular line, that fact is made known to the other branches so that it is almost a certainty that in one of the other branches some one will find this man's desire also the filling of a particular want for a man in that special line. In the same way if some particular business or industry needs men, the Government Employment Bureau is used as a speedy and effective way to bring labor and industry together. It often happens that there will be a scarcity of labor in one part of the country and a surplus in another. The Government Employment Bureaux make an ideal medium for the righting of this condition. Special fares on the railways permit the transfer of labor from one point in Canada to another with economy. These special fares provide that transportation over \$4. may be made at a rate of one cent per mile.

The Government Bureaux here includes the Soldiers Civil Re-Establishment Branch under the charge of Mr. H. C. Garner, and the Ontario Department of Labor represented by Mr. D. F. Ryan. The office here is also in close touch with the Dominion Department of Labor and its many branches and with many other departments devoted to the interests of labor and industry, through the clearing houses at Toronto, Ottawa, and other centres. Employers and employees are brought into touch and kept in touch with each other. Under the present system there is confidence developing on both sides and both parties to the labor question feel that they are getting a fair, square deal from the intermediary—the Government Bureaux. Both sides also are growing to realize that they are expected to give each other the same fair, square deal. The extensive and unsatisfactory days of the old employment agency system are at an end. The local branch shows how satisfactory may be the workings of this Government Bureaux plan. Here all employers (employers and employees alike) are assured of the most helpful and courteous consideration at all times, and it is only necessary to know those in charge, Messrs. Garner and Ryan, to appreciate the reason for the growth of confidence in the plan by the general public.

**SCHREIBER GOLD SAID  
TO RUN \$22 TO \$55 PER TON.**

Assays made of the ore located at a point about five miles north of Schreiber show values running from \$22 to \$55 per ton in gold. A few of the samples are said to run into thousands of dollars in gold to the ton, but there is little definite yet as to the extent of the find. The discovery was made some weeks ago by William Longworth that there was gold in this particular section of country and since then other prospectors have also made discoveries. No large dyke or other indication of any material body of gold-bearing ore in commercial quantities has yet been uncovered, but of course this may yet occur. In the meantime the particulars regarding the matter are so recent and the information so uncertain that there is no noticeable rush of prospectors to the territory, though of course a few prospectors have very naturally gone in to see what is doing.

Local dealers report an unusually brisk sale of traps and other supplies for those who go after furs. The prices of all furs are at a high level and there is a brisk demand. Evidently in this locality there is going to be an earnest effort made to supply any demand there may be.

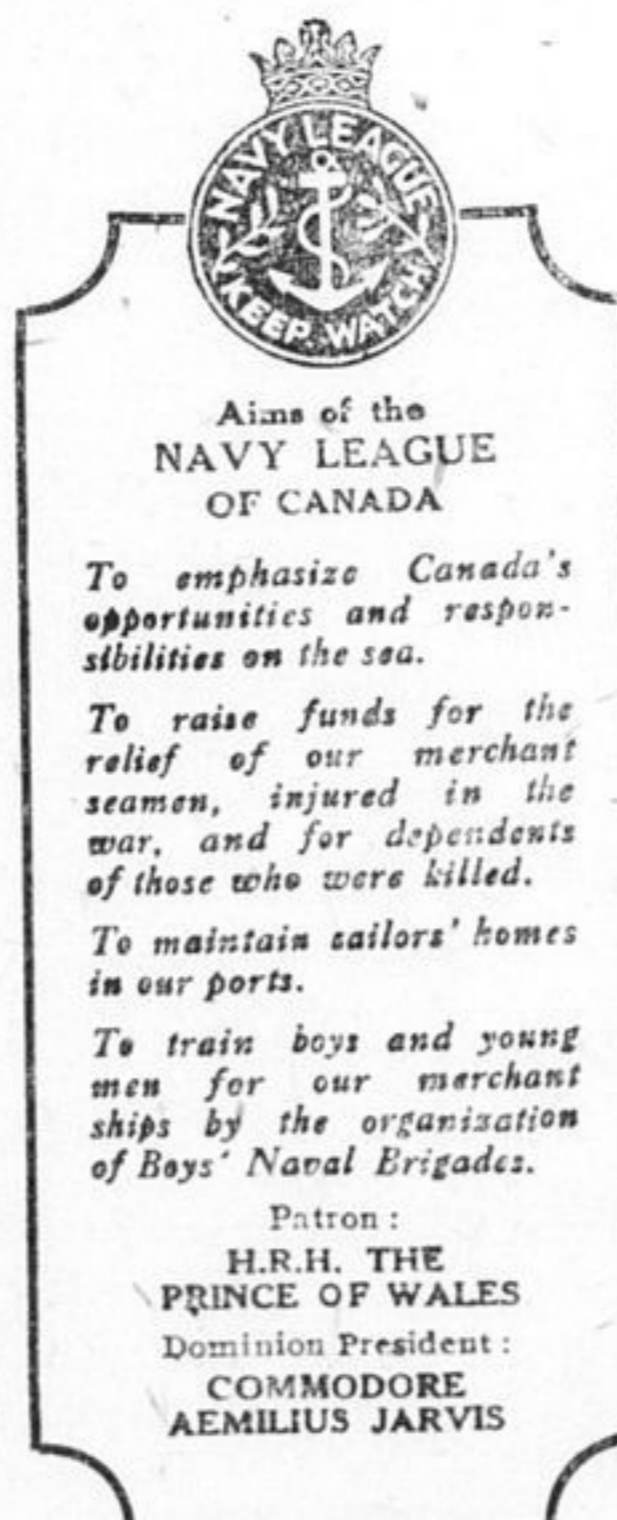
