## HOLLINGER STORES NOW OPEN TO GENERAL PUBLIC

Employees of Hollinger Mine Given  
Special 15 per cent. Reduction  
By Coupon Plan.

Last week the announcement was made by the Hollinger Stores that effective at once the stores would be open for business with the general public. Pending arrangements in connection with the charter of the company the stores had previously been open only to employees of the Hollinger and the McIntyre Mines. The announcement that the stores are now open to the general public will be received with general satisfaction, as the public have missed the service of these two stores (formerly the Gordon and McLaughlin stores.) The employees of the Hollinger Mine will continue to receive special advantage from the Hollinger Stores. The Hollinger Stores have made their prices as low or lower than any of the other stores in town, and from these general prices the Hollinger employees receive a straight discount of 15 per cent. through a coupon system. The coupons are sold at the mine to employees and by this coupon plan the employees can purchase a dollar's worth of merchandise at the stores for 85 cents.

## NEW MINING COMPANIES RECENTLY INCORPORATED.

Among the new mining companies recently incorporated is the Hiesha Mines of Porcupine Limited, a private Ontario Company with a capitalization of \$40,000; head office, Toronto; authorized to do business as miners. The Ontario Feldspar, Limited is another recent incorporation, with a capitalization of \$100,000.00, and a very comprehensive charter. Still another is the R. A. P. Gold Mining Company of Boston Creek, Limited, with 2,000,000 shares of \$1.00 each par value. This new company is apparently an incorporation of the former R. A. P. syndicate that has been working in the Boston Creek area for considerable time past. The incorporators are given as:—Mayne Josephine Kelly, stenographer; May L. Quinlan, company secretary, Niagara Falls; N. S. Macdonald, G. S. Hodgson, barristers, of Toronto, and Cecil Alvin Louch, Toronto, student at law.

## CHAMPIONSHIP BOXING AND WRESTLING BOUTS.

The announcement is made this week of a Championship Wrestling and Boxing Tournament to be held in the New Empire Theatre Basement on Thursday, October 23rd. ## AXE SLIPPED AND ARTERY WAS SEVERED.

Mr. R. H. Browne, an old prospector of this North Land, recently met with a fearful accident in the Matachewan bush. He was out working on some claims he has in Matachewan many miles away from settlements or people, and while chopping some wood for his camp fire the axe slipped and the blade struck him in the ankle. One of the arteries was severed and it looked as if Mr. Browne was doomed to die from loss of blood. However, with the courage, patience and persistence of the prospector, and the resourcefulness developed from having to depend upon oneself, Mr. Browne did not give up the problem, and after several hours of careful effort was able to stop the flow of blood sufficiently to enable him to reach his canoe after a hard journey through the bush. In his canoe he managed to make his way to help and medical attention. Mr. Browne is now well on the way to recovery from his serious injury. He is a man of 55 years of age, but he has the rugged health and the strong constitution of the typical prospector, and he came through the strain and stress of his experience, scores of miles away from a doctor, without losing his calm or his courage.

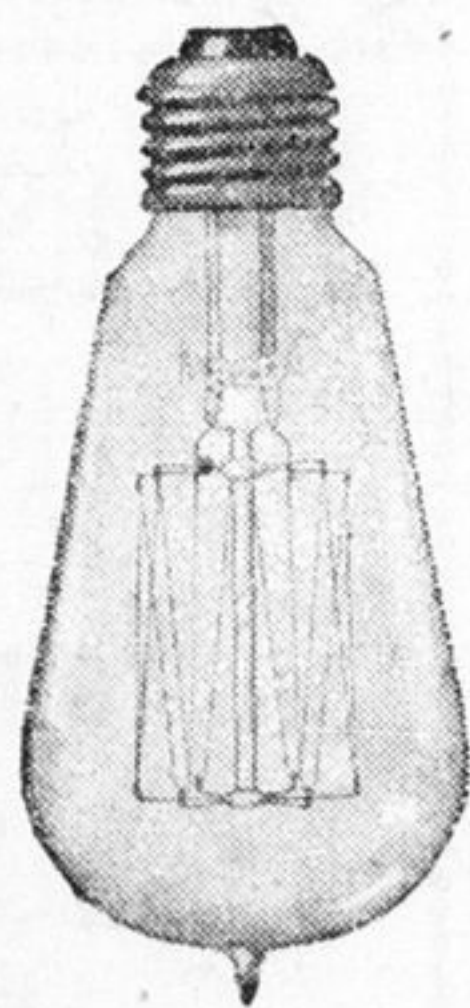

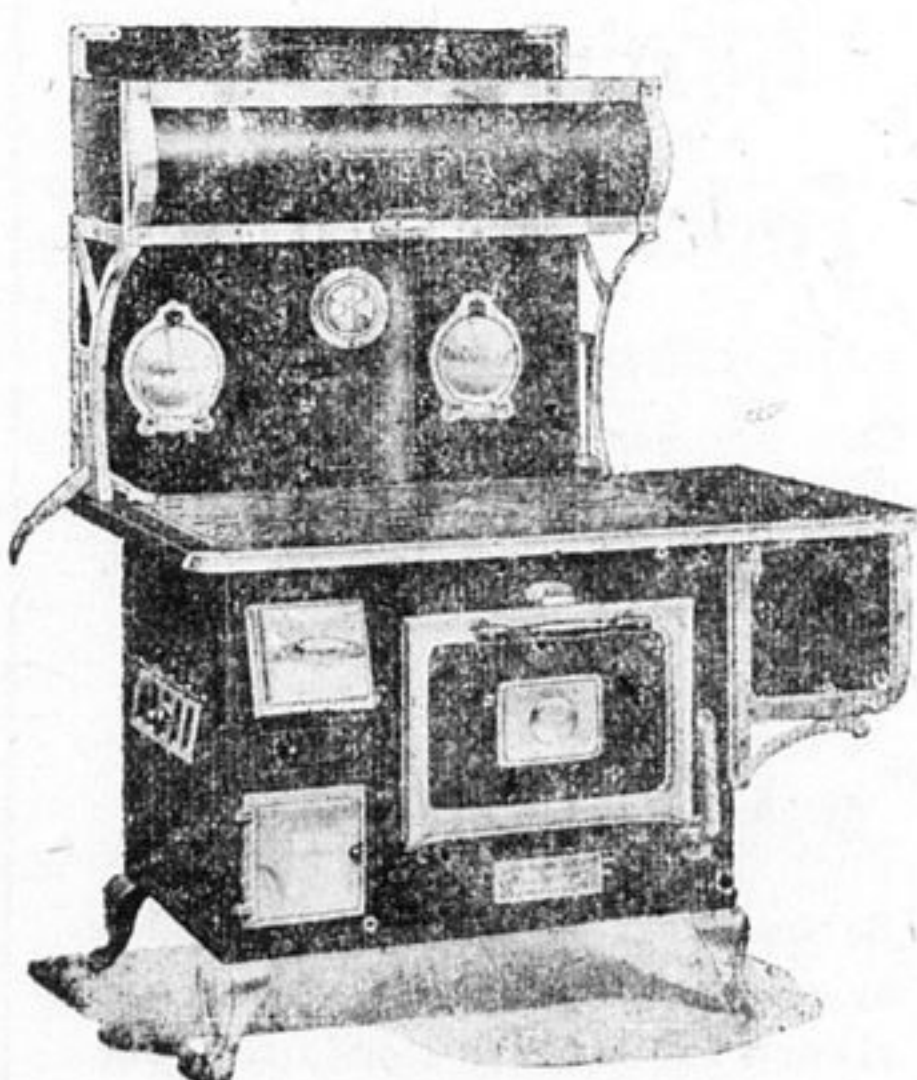

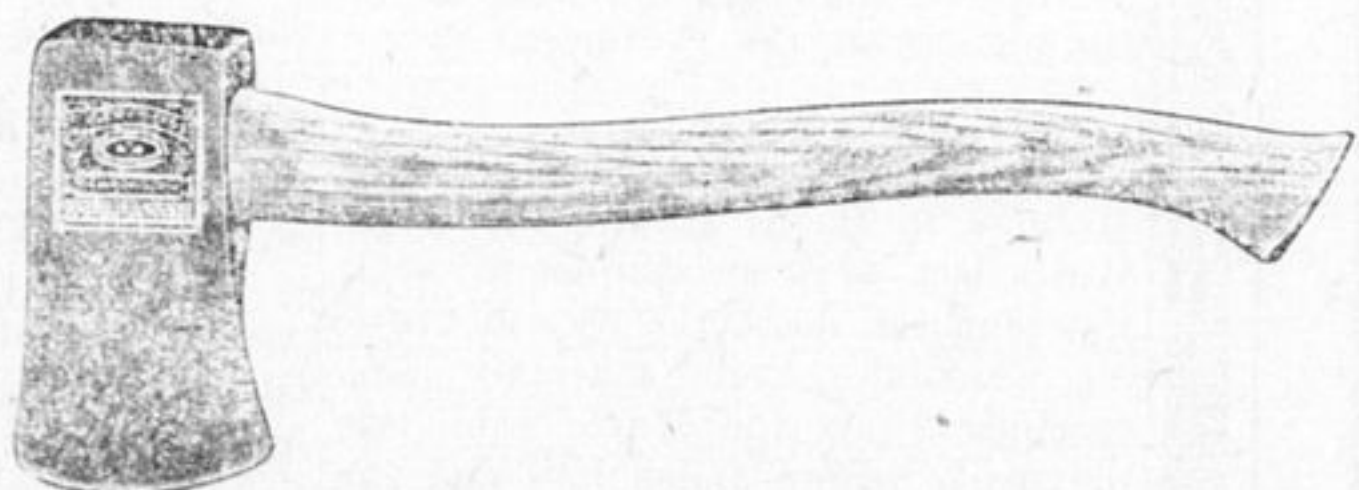
