AND THESE ARE THE DAYS OF SPEEDY TRAVELLING?

Every once in a while the people of this supposedly swift modern world should sit down and read the fable of the race between the hare and the tortoise,—just to keep from getting unduly in love with themselves and their supposedly speedy ways. These are commonly credited, for instance, with being-times of remarkably rapid travellings. Distance is often egotistically claimed as annihilated by the swift modern man. Messages, we conceitedly kid ourselves into believing, circle the earth like a lightning flash. Good night, good night! And then, occasionally we wake up in the morning to something like the following:—On October 20th 1918, a lady in town wrote a letter to a soldier serving overseas. The letter left Timmins on Oct. 20th 1918, and the soldier, Jimmy Saloman, duly received that letter on Oct. 23rd 1919. It just took one year and three days for that message to half circle the globe. They were nearly as swift as that in the days of Columbus. Friend Count Frontenac would have fired a messenger in his days for such slow delivery. DOG POISONERS AT WORK AT SCHUMACHER LAST WEEK.

Dog poisoners have been at work at Schumacher recently and much serious loss has occurred to dog owners as a result. A week ago no less than eight dogs at Schumacher passed away as a result apparently of the evil work of the dog poisoners. There were several fine sleigh dogs in the number poisoned and this means much loss not only to the owners of the dogs, but also to the district, for dog teaming is still a necessity to some extent in the Porcupine. It is understood that the police are after the criminals responsible for the cruel deaths of the dogs and if the police are successful in their search it is to be trusted that the culprits

will be severely dealt with by the law. Common sense and decency, as well as the law of the land, are against the placing out of poison where useful and valuable animals may suffer from it, and the carelessness or criminality that will allow valuable dogs to be poisoned in this way should be severely punished. As the owner of one fine Porcupine dog team said last week, it is easier to secure a good team of horses than a good team of sleigh dogs these days, for you can usually get the desired horse team if you will pay the price, but often neither love nor money can buy the desired dog team. The argument that dogs sometimes are a nuisance has no weight in the matter, as there is a legal way to deal with any such annoyance, and the indiscriminate use of poison is certainly no proper method to consider. Every good citizen should do everything possible to help preserve the very useful and necessary type of sleigh dogs in this country, even to the extent of assisting in bringing to justice the person or persons responsible for the present serious losses of valuable dogs.

ANOTHER CASE OF BULL MOOSE SUICIDE IN WEST.

A fully developed bull moose committed suicide on a telephone wire at Herb Lake, Manitoba, recently, according to The Pas Herald. The animal attempted to dash across the Hudson Bay Railway track. The telephone wire was hanging low, and the bull moose slashed into it with desperate fury. As a result the line broke and the end of the wire coiled around the moose's throat and in its ugly struggles the moose was strangled to death by the wire wound around its neck. An old-timer who witnessed the incident said that it really appeared as if the bull moose had deliberately slaughtered itself in this fashion, though, of course, it was all no doubt just a tragical accident from the moose's standpoint, fierce temper clouding his mind to what was happening or might happen.
