### MR. ANGUS McDONALD THE LABOR CANDIDATE

Convention at Englehart Selects Representative to Contest this Riding in Dominion House.

On Thursday of last week there was a joint convention at Englehart of the United Farmers of Ontario and the Independent Labor Party of this riding to select a candidate for Temiskaming for the House of Commons in the election made necessary by the death of Hon. Frank Cochrane. Mr. Angus J. McDonald, of Cobalt, commonly known as "Long Angus McDonald," was eventually chosen as the joint candidate. There were four other nominations made at the joint convention, the names being:—Professor John Sharp, New Liskeard; N. R. Green, White River District; Alex Montgomery, who was defeated by Capt. Tom Magladeray in the recent Provincial contest in Temiskaming; and John Vanier, of Iroquois Falls, who was one of the three candidates here (in the Cochrane Riding) in the recent Provincial elections. Neither Mr. Vanier nor Mr. Montgomery, however, would allow their names to go on the ballot, and Mr. McDonald was elected on the first ballot over Messrs. Sharp and Green. Mr. McDonald received 54 votes, Professor Sharp was given 42 and Mr. Green had only 6. As "Long Angus" had a clear majority over the combined vote of the other two he was declared duly selected on the first ballot as the choice of the joint convention. On motion of Mr. Green, seconded by Prof. Sharp, the nomination was made unanimous.

There were 103 duly accredited delegates in attendance at the joint convention in Englehart. All parts of the riding were well represented and both the Labor element and the Farmers had good representation. There were a number of ladies included in the gathering and the meeting was an interesting one.

The convention sent the following telegram to the Premier-Elect, Mr. E. C. Drury:

"This joint convention of the U. F. O. and labor organizations of Temiskaming wish to congratulate you on your independent stand in the selection of your Cabinet. We are pleased that you have been able to make this selection without compromise with either of the old parties, and we trust that the spirit displayed may characterize your whole administration."

The convention was presided over by Mr. H. J. Everett, chairman of the Cobalt I. L. P. H. Illingworth was appointed secretary. The Credentials Committee was Messrs. Fred Pummell, of Charlton; John Vanier, of Iroquois Falls; and R. Aubert, of Elk Lake.

In accepting the nomination, Mr. Angus McDonald promised to do the very best that was in him to justify the confidence now shown him. He said that in his opinion there was no man in this country that should be shown as much consideration as the returned soldier, and he was in favor of all possible being done for the men back from overseas. "All that the country can do," Mr. McDonald suggested, should be done in the way of gratuities and all other ways for the returned man. Mr. McDonald also touched briefly on the unequal conditions under the present economic system and promised if elected to parliament to work for better conditions.
