people. The World even goes so far as to express open fear "that the great wealth of Northern Ontario may be concentrated in the hands of the few mining companies and the small population up there, so that they could divide it among themselves." To The World it may appear a crime that the men who have pioneered this country, the men who have risked their money, their strength, their talent and their very lives in its development, should share between them the fruits of their efforts and enjoy the wealth they have labored to produce. But the North Land views this differently. It is this difference of opinion that makes the agitation for secession so strong a movement in this North Land.

The World's pretended fears that evil "interests" naturally and inevitably would gain control of a new North Land Province are as groundless as its other suppositions. So far as these evil "interests" are concerned, it is not possible for the North Land to make a worse mess of handling them than the showing of the Old Ontario Government. The evil "interests" would certainly prefer to deal (as before) with the Old Ontario Governments, rather than with the democratic North Land people. The other kind of "interests," the mining interests, the lumbering interests, the business interests, and the "common-people" interests,—rather naturally believe that they themselves, knowing their own country and its resources and possibilities, and having faith and affection in this land, are the best qualified to conduct its affairs intelligently, economically and to the best interests of the North Land. Though The World holds up its horny hands in holy horror at the thought of the pioneers of this country owning and controlling it, the people of the North Land may be pardoned for feeling that no one has more right to own and control the wealth of a new land than the men and women who by their risk and toil and discomfort brought forward that wealth. The evil "interests" indeed would fare badly at the hands of a North Land legislature, but the good "interests" would be given a much fairer show in their work of building up the country and developing its resources.

There is absolutely no foundation for The World's insinuation that the International Nickel Company may be behind the proposal to make a new Province of the North Land. The World would be equally justified, or

perhaps, more warranted, in suggesting that the International Nickel caused prohibition to carry in Ontario. The World is becoming like the character in one of Dickens' books. This character was forever seeing the head of Charles the First in everything,—even in his soup plate. The World is seeing the International Nickel Company in everything,—even its dreams. For a newspaper to "see things" in the dry Province is to come under suspicion as to its motives or sanity. The World has no reason nor occasion for dragging in the International Nickel. So far as The Advance knows the International Nickel Co. has shown no special interest in the matter. And The Advance being the cause, more or less, of the present trouble knows a little more about it than The World, five hundred miles away. It is the people's agitation, not that of any big corporation. Indeed, it is certain big corporations or "interests" that the people in the North expect to have to fight for a fair deal in the matter.

If The World persists in seeking hidden motives, the world at large will soon be seeking The World's hidden motive for all this. The truth is that the present agitation for the creation of a new Province has grown among the people here because of the lack of interest and knowledge of North Land affairs shown by the people in the south; because this country feels itself neglected and its progress handicapped; because the people of Old Ontario and the people of Greater Ontario seem to be of different types with different aims and hopes and ambitions; because the less-thickly settled North does not want to be dominated by the more populous south; because with proper attention and care, the North Land believes it would have a much larger population and a much more rapid development; because the people of this country want to live their own lives in their own way and to work out, as they are striving to do the wonderful destiny of this rich country. The World may take it as a direct message from the North Land itself that if Old Ontario wants to retain the immense North Land (many times the size of the Mother Province, and rich beyond dreams in treasures of forest and mine), then Old Ontario will have to get down to genuine business and deal fairly and justly. There will have to be less of this "Wait for this!" and "Wait for the other!" There will need to be action. There will need to be interest, intelligence and generous justice at last. That will be all this time!

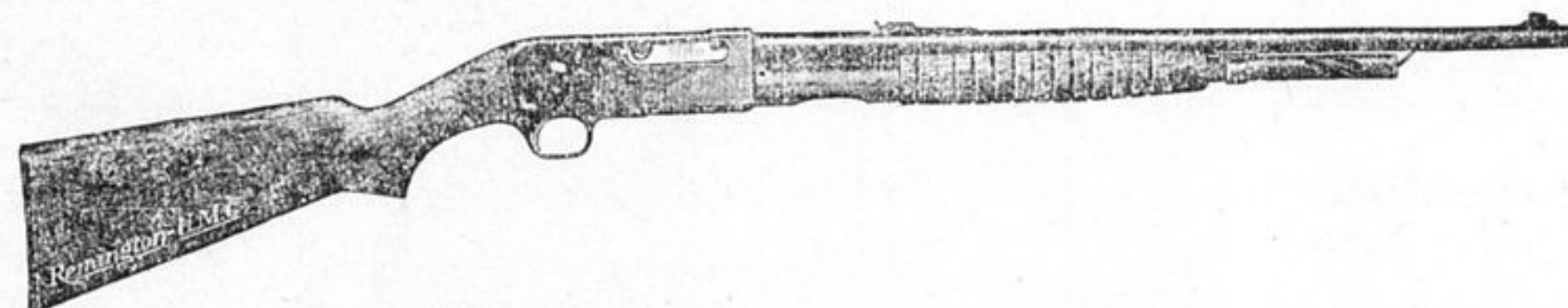

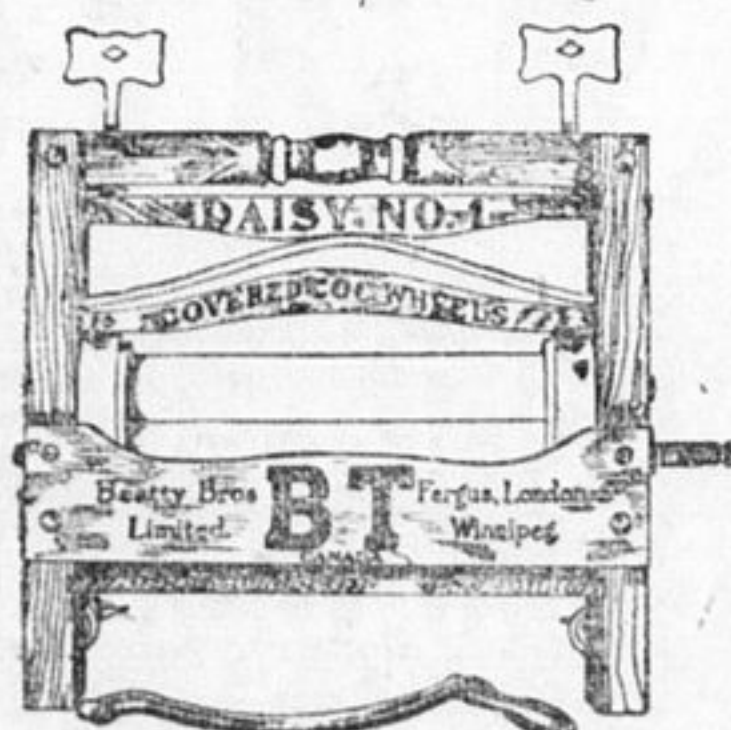

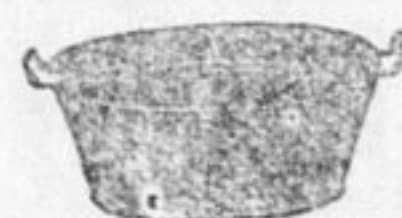
