MR. A. G. SLAGHT CHOSEN AS LIBERAL CANDIDATE

Convention Last Week at Englehart Makes Choice for Federal By-Election.

There were 106 delegates present at the Liberal Party Convention held at Englehart on Thursday last to select a candidate to contest the riding of Temiskaming in the approaching by-election necessary through the death of Hon. Frank Cochrane. Mr. A. G. Slaght, now of Toronto, but formerly resident in this riding was chosen by the Convention as the Liberal Candidate only one ballot being necessary. There were six men nominated:—A. G. Slaght, Toronto; Chas. Gallagher, South Porcupine; Dr. J. A. McInnis, Mayor of Timmins; C. A. Byam, of New Liskeard; Sylvester Kennedy, South Porcupine; R. S. Taylor, Cobalt. The three last named did not allow their names to go to the ballot. The vote on the three first named was announced as follows by the chairman:—Mr. Slaght, 62 votes; Mr. Gallagher, 25; Dr. McInnis 19. Before the voting there was some discussion on the advisability of adjourning the convention for a couple of weeks so as to secure more representative gathering. It was held that the northern part of the riding and especially the district west of Cochrane suffered from lack of delegates owing to the short notice given before the Convention was called. Mr. Albert Taylor, who was acting as chairman, said he would like to consider the advisability of delaying the selection of a candidate for another convention in a couple of weeks as on account of the mail service sufficient notification had hardly been possible, especially to points east and west from Cochrane. Dr. McInnis made a motion for the necessary adjournment pointing out that Timmins, for example, would have had a much more representative delegation had there been fuller and earlier notice. Had another week's notice been given there would at least been a third more present at the Convention. Mr. Sylvester Kennedy endorsed this position pointing out that the people west of Cochrane had practically had no notice, and consequently could not be represented. Mr. Byam said he sent all the notices on Nov. 25th and that all had had the necessary notice. Mr. J. A. Clermont thought there would be little representation in any case from points west of Cochrane. Mr. John Clark, of Iroquois Falls, thought the principle of postponing matters like this was not a good one, and Mr. Byam thought the Convention one of the best in the history of the riding.

When the question was put to a vote, seventy-seven voted for the present Convention, twenty-nine voting for an adjournment for a couple of weeks. The Convention then voted on the names mentioned above and Mr. Arthur G. Slaght the well-known barrister and solicitor, proved to be the choice of the representatives present. In his address to the Convention Mr. Slaght spoke of his interests in Temiskaming. While he admitted residence in Toronto, he said that everything he owned in the world, except some Victory Bonds and his Toronto residence, was in this riding, where his heart and interest were also. He favored the extension of the T. & N. O. to James Bay, the deepening of the French River, and other works for the North Land. He expressed himself also as in favor of the most generous treatment possible of the returned soldiers. While saying that he believed in Labor Unions, he suggested that radicalism in Labor's ranks might be a menace to-day.

Dr. McInnis mentioned the agitation for the secession of the North Land from the rest of Ontario. He was in favor of such a move unless the North Land were given better treatment than in the past. The policy of both the Federal and the Provincial Governments in the past, the Doctor said had been to take out of the North one hundred per cent, and give back about two and one-half per cent. "And you know what poor comfort that two-and-a-half per cent. stuff is," said the Doctor.

Mr. Gallagher spoke briefly but appropriately, expressing his confidence in Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King and the Liberal Party platform, and also touching on the needs of the North Land.

The Convention also elected the following officers for the Temiskaming Liberal Association:—

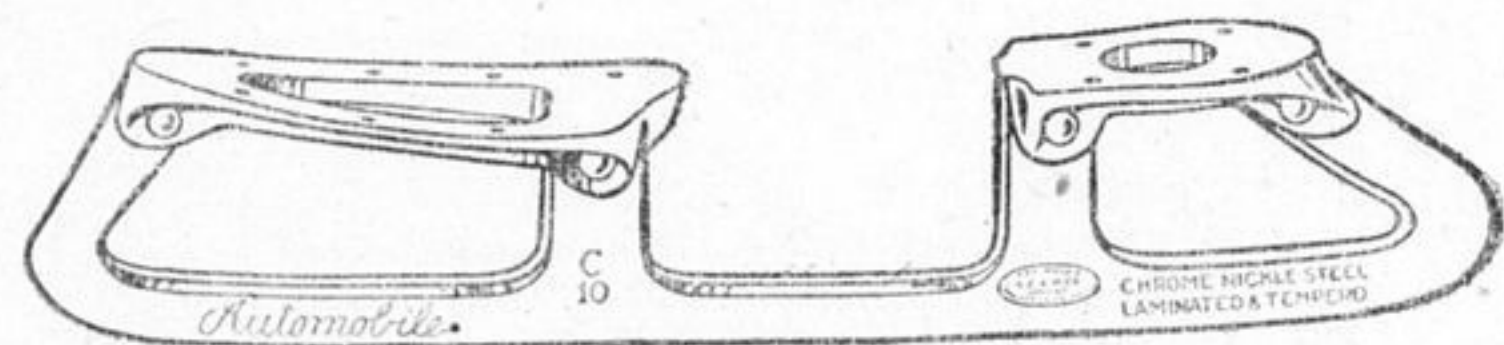
