E. H. BRIDGER OPEN AGAIN IN GOLDFIELDS ANNEX

Big Stock of Christmas Goods On Sale Now at Unusual Prices.

Mr. E. H. Bridger, who was one of the heavy losers through the damage caused by the recent fire that destroyed part of the block on Third Avenue near the station, has been able to open up business again this week, and has a very attractive line of Christmas goods on display in the Goldfields Annex on Fourth Avenue. The entrance is on Fourth Avenue, nearly opposite Dr. Brown's, and next door to Leduc's store. There is a big stock of special Christmas goods now on display. Nothing actually damaged by fire or water during the recent fire has been placed on sale, but there are many lines salvaged from the fire as well as some new Christmas stocks. There are mechanical trains, mechanical toys, dolls, teddy bears, fancy stationary, Christmas books, games, Christmas tree decorations, sleighs, wagons, toys, fancy goods of all descriptions, leather goods, china, etc. Everything is being sold regardless of cost, as Mr. Bridger is going out of business here after Christmas and so must dispose of all the stocks. THE VALUE OF SLEIGH DOGS IN THE FAR NORTH.

On several recent occasions The Advance has referred to the high prices quoted in this district for sleigh dogs, and the practical impossibility of always procuring suitable dogs at any price. Similar conditions seem to prevail at other far north centres. In a recent issue The Pas (Manitoba) Herald says: "Sleigh dogs are worth as much as a team of horses in the North Land, and the demand is still increasing for them. The reasons for this remarkable situation may be ascribed to two causes, viz., greater number of trappers and prospectors using dogs over any previous year, and the shortage of supply. Hardly a day goes by without a half dozen persons in search of dogs. Fifty and seventy-five dollars a head have been offered, and calculating on this basis a team of five dogs is worth three hundred and a quarter, a little more than an average team of horses. A few years ago sleigh dogs were sold at between ten and fifteen dollars."
