LAST MINUTE SUGGESTIONS FOR CHRISTMAS BUYERS

WINTER SEARCH FOR OIL IN JAMES BAY DISTRICT.

A small expedition will start from Kapuskasing about Jan. 15th and will proceed along the river there towards James Bay, part of the journey being made across country. The equipment of the party will include a small drilling outfit. It is stated that a leading authority has estimated the possible occurrence of petroleum in the district to be visited and that an extensive prospective oil field may be found between James Bay and the National Transcontinental. Dominion Government Geologist M. Y. Williams who visited the district last summer is of a similar opinion regarding the possibility of a good oil field. The expedition during the coming January is a private enterprise, a large amount of territory having previously been staked out. The drilling outfit to be taken with the party will be adequate for drilling to a depth of 900 feet. Should indications of a substantial oil field be discovered, it is likely that it will settle the question of a railway to James Bay. If there were valuable oil fields to be developed there could be little question then about the advisability of extending the T. & N. O. northwards to serve the territory between Cochrane and James Bay. The results of this oil prospecting trip will accordingly be looked forward to with considerable general interest.

U. F. O. RECOMMEND GOOD ROADS POLICY FOR NORTH.

At the U. F. O. Convention last week in Toronto a resolution was passed recommending that a definite good roads policy be adopted and carried out regarding Northern Ontario. This resolution should strengthen the hands of the Ontario Government in dealing with the problems that were impressed upon the Premier and his colleagues during their recent visit to the North Land. A practical and consistent road policy is one of the great needs of the North Land. In the past much of the money spent on roads in the North has been wasted, due to the fact that a proper policy was never adopted. Throughout the North the land is dotted with roads that are now overgrown again. They were built because some particular interests or some special pull suggested their construction, and their use to the people generally did not warrant their cost. On the other hand there are roads that are in great need of construction or repair in the general interest. A comprehensive policy, looking to the development of the country and the advantage of the people here, and disregarding other considerations, is badly needed at the Ontario Government headquarters.

Another recommendation passed by the U. F. O. convention was to the effect that the proposed sale of the T. & N. O. Railway to the Dominion Government be postponed until the opinion of the people in general be secured in the matter. Still another resolution passed by the Farmers' Convention was to have the Chairmanship of the T. & N. O. Commission placed in the hands of a competent and experienced railway official.

Other resolutions may be summarized as follows:—Requesting the abolition of the Canadian Senate; demanding the Orders-in-Council passed during the war prohibiting the importation of certain religious and economic books be rescinded. There was also a resolution expressing some doubt as to the advisability of expending millions on hydro-electric railways and requesting the Legislature to "go slowly" on this question.

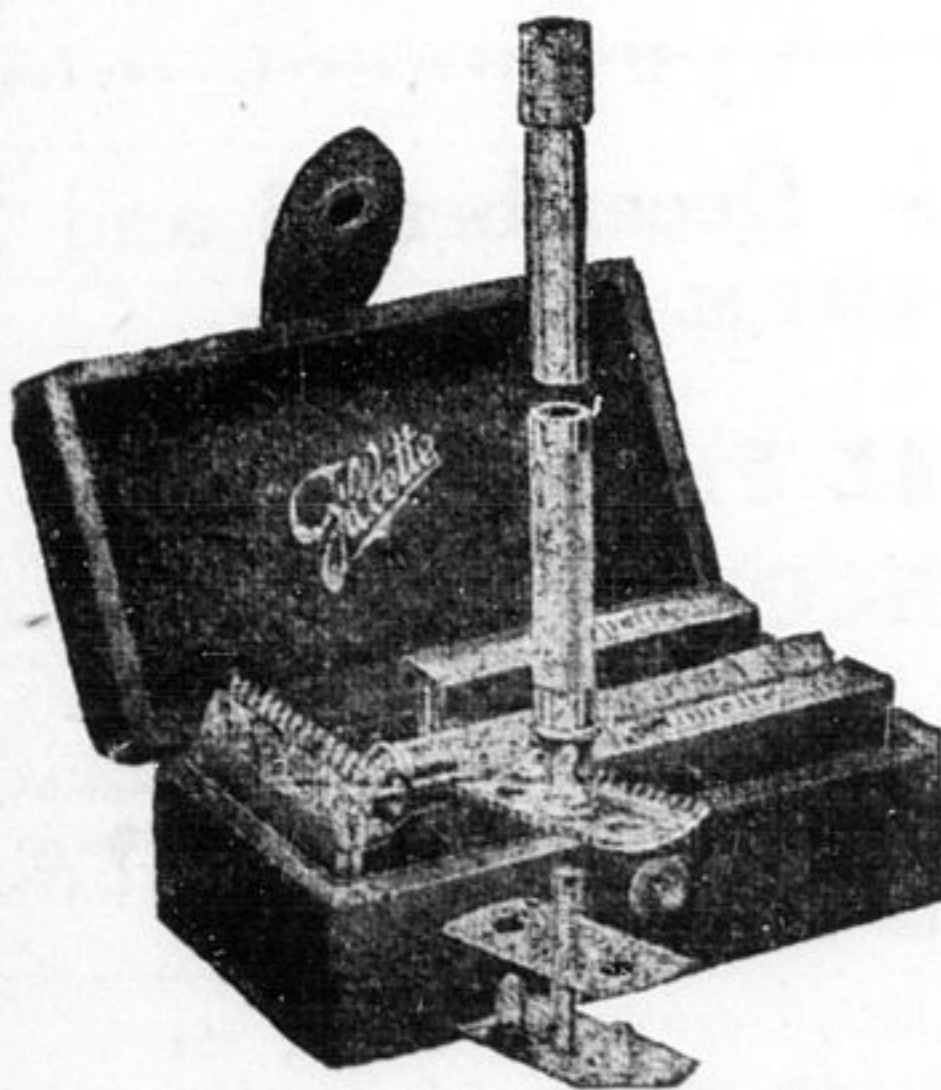

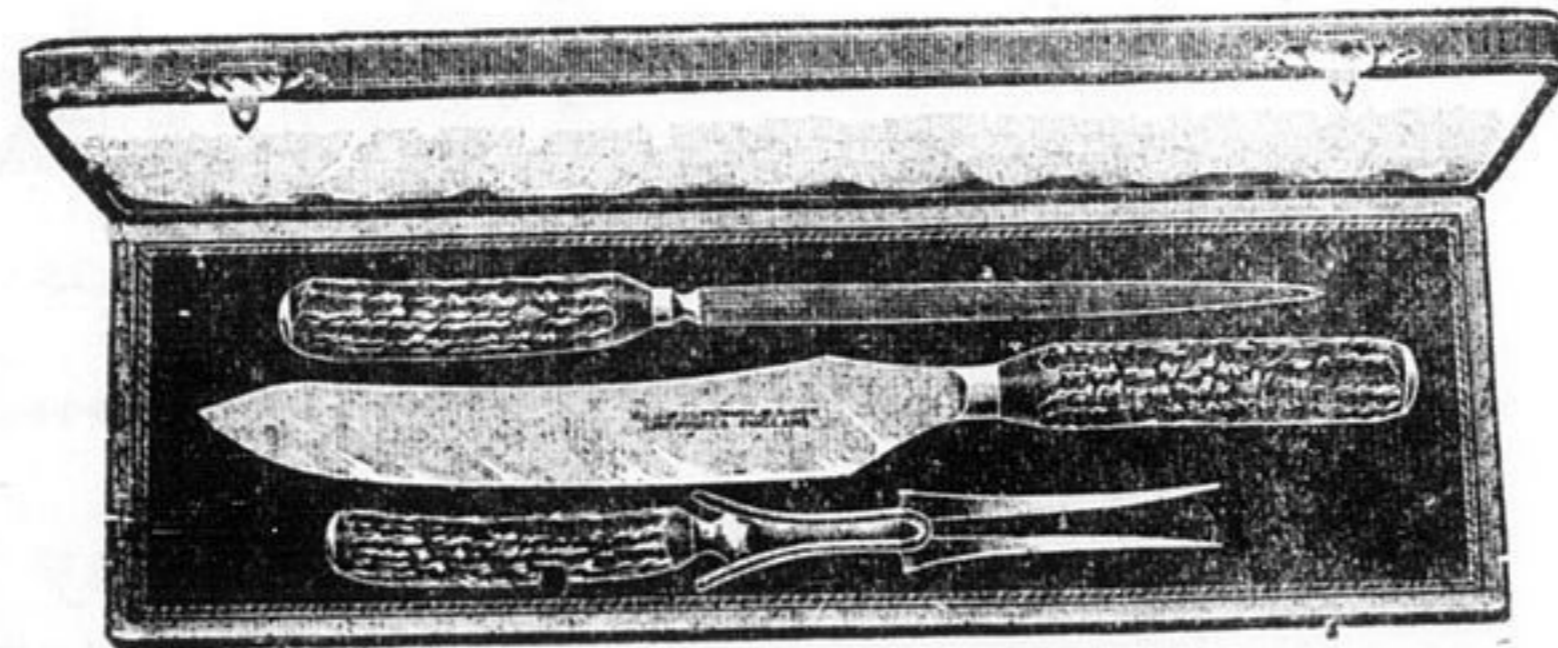

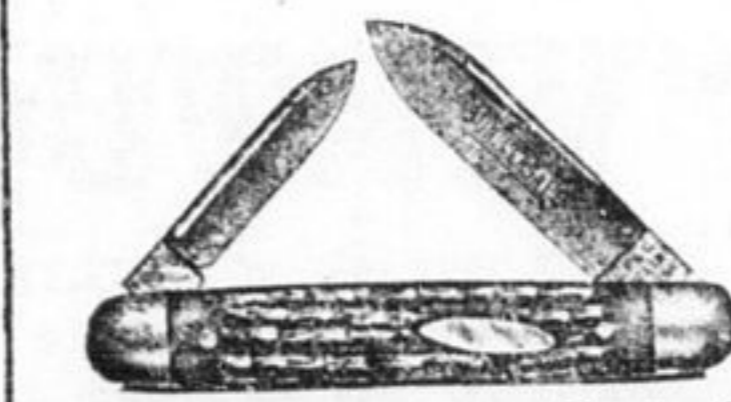
