MOUNTJOY SETTLERS ASK FOR MANY IMPROVEMENTS

Government Petitioned Regarding
Building Roads and Schools,
and Siding for Spur
Line, Etc.

Following instructions from the Mountjoy Settlers' Association, the secretary, Mr. F. M. Wallingford has sent the Cabinet Ministers concerned, a number of resolutions passed at recent meetings of the Association. These resolutions include requests for forest fire prevention measures, better roads and schools, a siding to connect with the spur line now built from Timmins to the Mattagami River, etc. The resolutions include the following:—

Moved by John Power, seconded by S. P. Lindsay,—that the following resolutions be forwarded to the Minister of Lands and Forests, Ontario:—Whereas the settlers of Mountjoy Township expect the Ontario Government will grant funds necessary to carry on the improvements and building of roads according to the merits of the settlement. And whereas in the past the men in charge of road building were appointed or chosen by outsiders without the local citizens and settlers having a voice in the matter of choice. And whereas when roads were improperly built or located the citizens had no opportunity or means of remonstrating or demanding redress. Be it resolved that the Ontario Government or the officials in charge of Public Works be asked to give to the citizens and settlers of Mountjoy Township the privilege to choose a man competent and known to be reliable, as well as suitable to all the citizens and settlers for the position of foreman or superintendent of road building in the Township of Mountjoy. Further, be it resolved that if at any time the citizens and settlers as a whole find that they have been disappointed in their choice through incompetence of the superintendent or other valid reasons, providing sufficient proof of disqualification be given, that the citizens and settlers have the right or privilege to demand the resignation of said superintendent.—Carried unanimously.

Moved by S. McChesney, seconded by John Power, that the Ontario Government be asked to intercede with the T. & N. O. Railway Commission to have a proper siding built on the

Mattagami Townsite for the accommodation of the settlers of Mountjoy Township and the general public, because the Railway spur as it is now accommodates only one lumber firm and two tie contractors and not the settlers or the general public.—Carried.

A letter enclosing a copy of the above resolution was also sent to the Chairman of the T. & N. O. Railway Commission.

Moved by Chas. E. Wallingford, seconded by Fabian Boissouneault, that the Department of Lands and Forests be asked to clear enough land in the vicinity of the settlement of Mattagami Heights to protect said Town and settlement from forest fires.—Carried.

A resolution was also forwarded to the Minister of Education for Ontario in this resolution it was shown that it is the hope of the citizens and settlers of Mountjoy Township that prompt steps will be taken by the Department to have a school organized within the community.

In the letter to the Hon. Benial Bowman, Minister of Lands and Forests, the secretary says:—“The settlers and citizens of the Township of Mountjoy have instructed me to forward you the enclosed resolutions regarding the building of roads and school, as well as the construction of a siding connecting with the spur line now built from Timmins to the Mattagami River. It is the hope of the settlers of Mountjoy Township that you will give these matters your careful consideration and that your Department will without delay take steps to have these necessary improvements completed, thereby encouraging the settlers now established here and induce others to take up land in the district. We ask not for special favours, but only for that which we as pioneers deserve.

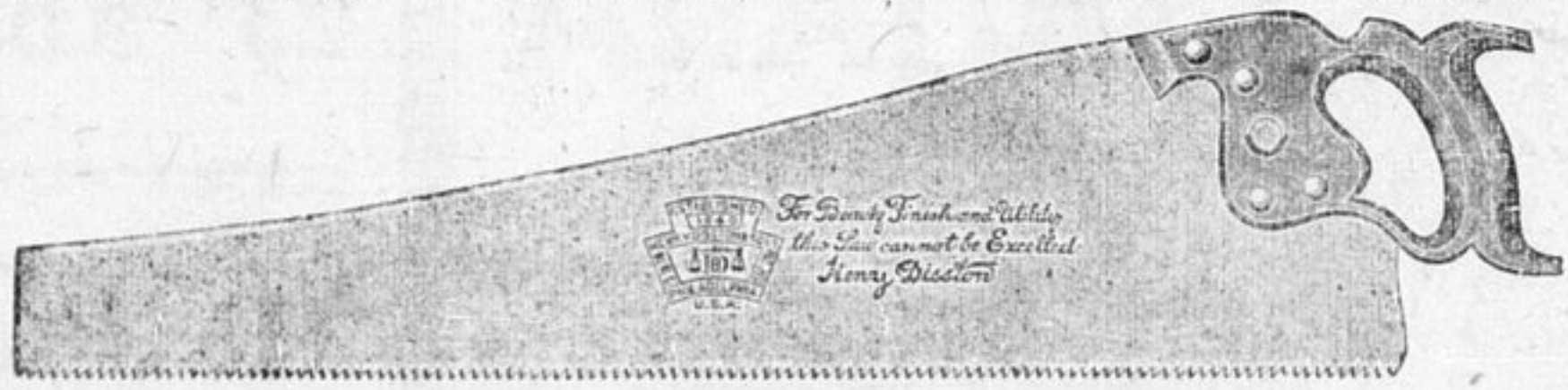

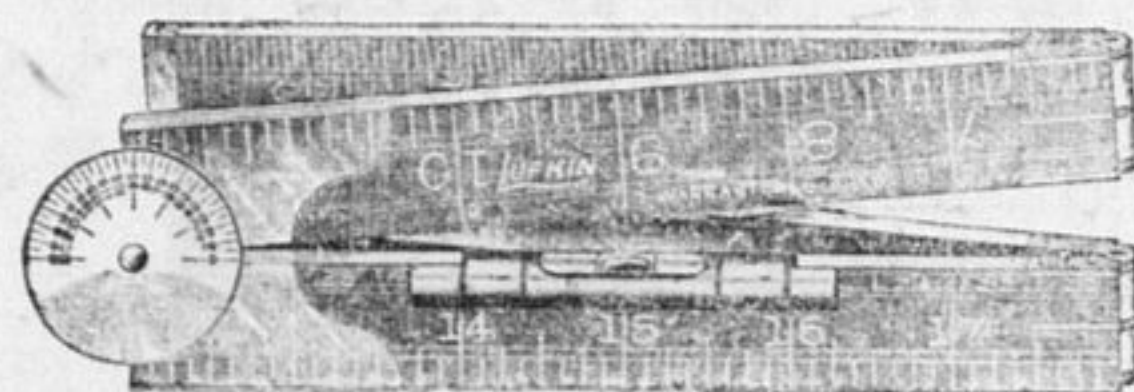
