## PERCENTAGES RECEIVED BY THE HOCKEY CLUBS.

In view of some of the discussion regarding the proportion of gate receipts from hockey games going to the clubs and to the rink, the following little item from The Haileyburian will be of interest:—"It is not generally known, but 50 per cent. of the gate goes to the Haileybury Hockey Club and 50 to the Haileybury Rink. Considering that the clubs get only 30 per cent. at Cobalt, and at New Liskeard only 25 per cent. the Haileybury Rink Co., is very generous in their allowance."

It was understood at the opening of the season that the Timmins Rink should get 60 per cent. and the Hockey Club 40 per cent. of the gate, but this was changed to a 50-50 basis, so that Timmins Rink is just as generous as the Haileybury Rink in this matter, and the hockey boys here are as well used as the Haileybury boys who think they are the best treated in the N. O. H. A.

## REGULAR HOURS AND GOOD HABITS NECESSARY.

Some months ago it was proposed that some of the winning dog teams from The Pas, Manitoba, be brought to Timmins to take part in the big Dog Team Race here this year, as the Hudson Bay Dog Derby and the Porcupine Dog Team Race are the only two big dog races in Canada. The expense incurred, seemed to be too great to allow a visit from the experts of the far north Manitoba Camp. In the meantime at least one of those spoken of as good material to bring down here to show the Porcupine a few pointers in Dog Team Racing has gone into intensive training for the Pas event. The Pas Herald tells the story as follows:—"Bateese Campbell has gone into training for the dog race, 'I fancy,' says Magistrate Wales, 'that you require 45 days of continued exercise under the watchful eye of Sheriff Ridyard and therefore it is the wish of the court that you be taken from hence and put to work for the town.' Bateese has been handsomely soused on several occasions, and he finally tumbled into the clutch of the police." Bateese will be out in time for the Hudson Bay Dog Derby and if some one only takes good care of his dogs in the meantime he will perhaps take his revenge on society by corraling the Hudson Bay Dog Derby trip y.—the highest honor and the most distinguished and envied object in the whole Pas district.

## "BOLSHEVIKI" SHIPPED FROM KAPUSKASING CAMP.

There has been considerable publicity given to the recent deportation of troublesome "Bolsheviki" style of aliens from the United States. Referring to this, Lieut.-Col. W. E. Dale officer in command of the Internment Camp at Kapuskasing, stated at Mont real last week that Canada had been considerably in advance of the U. S. A. in this action. In June of last year during the Labor troubles at Winnipeg the Royal North West Mounted Police had quietly gathered in about 100 prominent "Reds" who were attempting evil agitation in the west, and these trouble-makers were quietly shipped to Kapuskasing. From Kapuskasing they were later deported to their European homes, with practically no special publicity. There are still some more of these "Bolsheviki" talking gentlemen to be deported. During the past year well over a thousand of the troublesome mischief-brewing aliens have been shipped back to their homelands, and there are a few others who will still be picked up and packed back overseas. Canada has not made any particular publicity about this good work, possibly because of some sense of shame for the way the alien enemies were allowed to go their way free and unbecked in the early days of the war when they seemed indeed to have special favors and to be specially privileged. The progress of the war, however, has resulted in some of the more troublesome of the aliens being shipped from here,—which may be set down as one advantage secured by Canada from its part in the war.

According to The Pas Herald, there is not an empty house at the Pas, Manitoba, and travellers have to sleep on cots in the hallways of hotels and boarding houses.

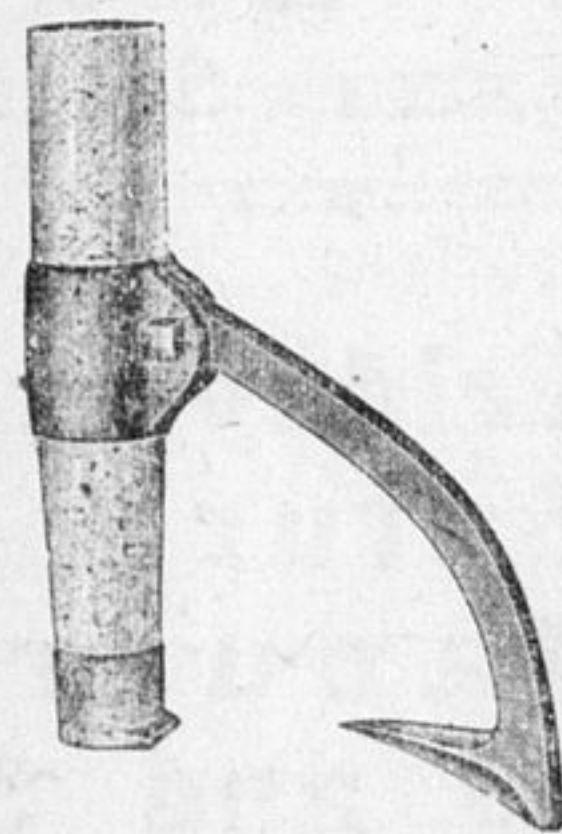

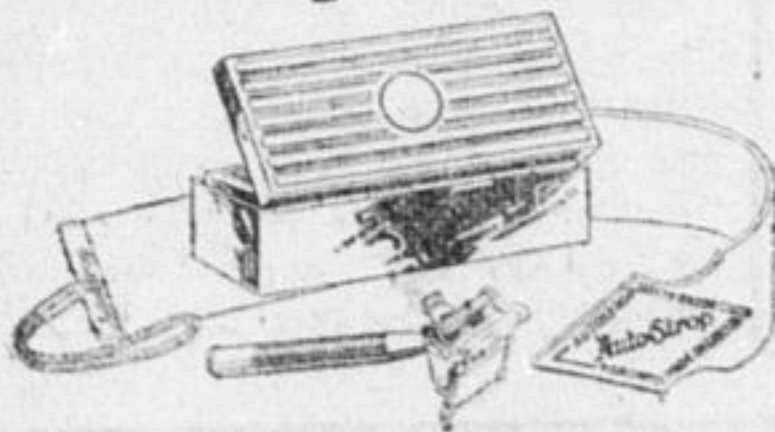

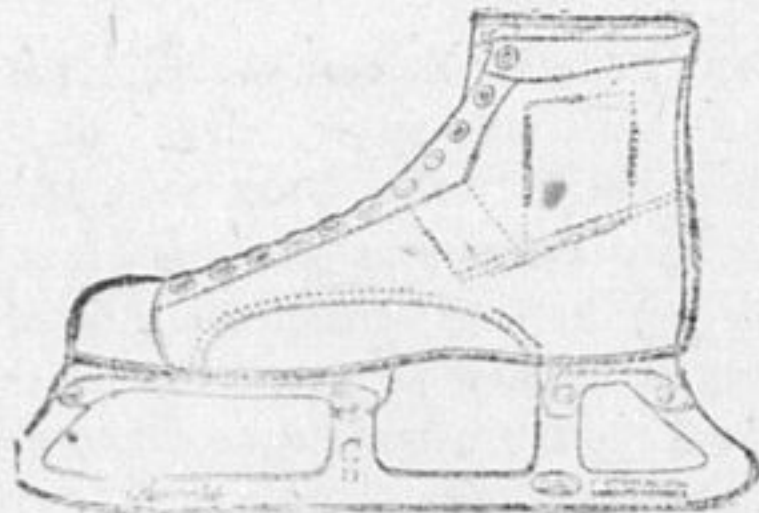
