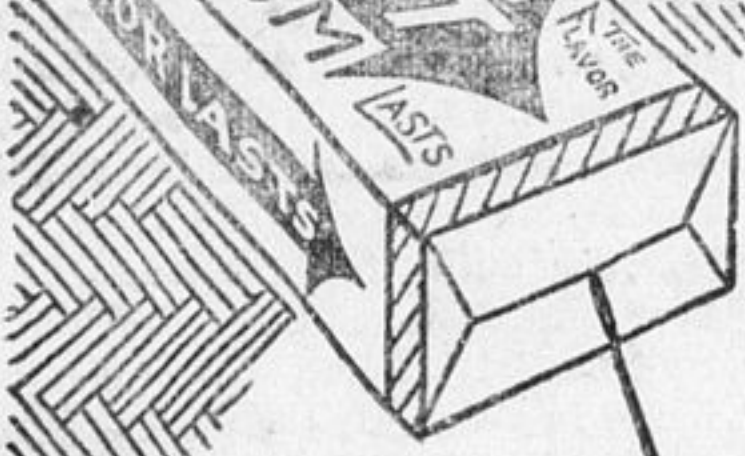

## CONSTITUTION TIMMINS ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

By-laws, Etc., Adopted by Athletic Association Here.

At the annual general meeting of the Timmins Amateur Athletic Association, a report of which meeting will be found elsewhere in this issue, the following Constitution and By-laws were submitted and adopted for the guidance of the Association and the management of its affairs:—

1. This Association shall be called "The Timmins Amateur Athletic Association" and shall be composed of the members of the Timmins Football, Baseball and Lacrosse Associations and of such other Clubs and individuals as may hereafter be admitted to the association.

2. Its objects shall be the encouragement of athletic sports and the providing of rational amusements and recreations for its members and the people of the Porcupine Camp.

3. Should other clubs desire admission to the Association, the terms of affiliation shall first be approved by the Board of Governors, and if subsequently ratified by the Voting Committee at any regular meeting, or at a special meeting to be called for that purpose, the Constitution and By-laws shall be amended accordingly.

4. The annual meeting of the Association shall be held on the first Thursday in May, or such other date as is unanimously agreed on by the Board of Governors, and a quorum for such meeting shall consist of at least three members from each of the affiliating clubs and a majority of the Board of Governors then serving.

5. Other meetings shall be called by the President from time to time as required.

Article 2.—Section 1. The membership of this Association shall be limited to (a) members of the affiliated associations; (b) Any person who, in consideration of particular services to the Association, shall be elected an honorary member by the Voting Committee.

2. Membership shall be attested by the Secretary of each of affiliated Associations who shall file a list of the members of his Association

3. Such lists may be filed from time to time as members are added to the different Associations, and the Secretary-Treasurer shall preserve these lists among the records of this Association.

Article 3. Section 1. The management of this Association shall be vested in a Board of Governors, which shall consist of the following members:—(a) A President who shall be elected annually by the Voting Committee; (b) A Secretary-Treasurer who shall be elected annually by the Voting Committee; (c) A representative of the Hollinger Consolidated Gold Mines who shall be appointed by that company; (d) A representative appointed by the Timmins Football Association; (e) A representative appointed by the Timmins Baseball Association; (f) A representative appointed by the Timmins Lacrosse Association.

2. The President and the Secretary-Treasurer of this Association shall be elected annually by a "Voting Committee" which shall consist of three members from each of the affiliated associations.

3. Such election shall be held within one week subsequent to the annual meeting of this Association, and the President shall appoint the time and place of such election and shall preside, and the Secretary-Treasurer shall record the action of the Voting Committee, but neither the President nor Secretary-Treasurer shall vote at such election.

4. The executive of each of the affiliated associations shall appoint, annually, three members who are representatives of their association to act on the Voting Committee, and shall notify the Secretary of the Timmins Amateur Athletic Association of the names of such representatives, such notification to be in writing and given to the Secretary-Treasurer of the T. A. A. before the annual election of officers.

5. Amendments to these by-laws shall be made by a majority vote of the Voting Committee at any regular or special meeting of such committee.

6. The management of the Athletic Field shall be vested in the Board of Governors of this Association, and all matters pertaining to the use of the field shall be determined by a majority vote of the Board.

7. The funds of this Association shall be kept in a chartered bank and shall be withdrawn only on the joint cheque of the President and the Secretary-Treasurer. The Secretary-Treasurer shall retain the cancelled cheques, together with vouchers showing in detail the expenditures of the Association, and shall submit an itemized statement of all receipts and expenditures for the year at the annual meeting of this Association.

These By-laws, etc., will be of special interest to all concerned in amateur athletics in the town, and it might be a good plan for those interested to clip this statement of the Constitution and By-laws of the Timmins Amateur Athletic Association and preserve it for reference.

### GOVERNMENT ASKED TO

INCREASE WOLF BOUNTY.

The last issue of The Sudbury Star says:—

"On behalf of the Sudbury District Fish & Game Protective Association, Rev. Father Crowley went to Toronto this week to urge before the Fish & Game Committee of the Legislature that the bonus on wolves be increased from \$20.00 to \$50.00, and that the pelts go to the Government, as at present. It was pointed out that at present a man killing a wolf got more for selling the pelt than he did for reporting to the Government and getting the \$20.00 bonus. The committee passed a resolution recommending to the provincial treasurer that the bounty be increased to \$50.00. The new bonus, which will undoubtedly have the treasurer's approval, will be of interest to trappers in the north country. Representatives from the Canadian National Railways and the C. P. R. appeared before the committee and protested against the season for deer being later. They wanted it in October. The committee, however, stuck to their season, allowing only five days in October, and the season decided for the country north of the French and Mattawa rivers will be from October 25th to November 30th."
