INCREASE WOLF BOUNTY.

"On behalf of the Sudbury District Fish & Game Protective Association, Rev. Father Crowley went to Toronto this week to urge before the Fish & Game Committee of the Legislature that the bonus on wolves be increased from \$20.00 to \$50.00 and that the pelts go to the Government, as at present.' It was pointed out that at present a man killing a wolf got more for selling the pelt that he did for reporting to the Government and getting the \$20.00 bonus. The committee passed a resolution recommending to the provincial treasurer that the bounty be increased to \$50.00. The new bonus, which will undoubtedly have the treasurer's approval, will be of interest to trappers in the north country. Representatives from the Canadian National Railways and the C. P. R. appeared before the committee and protested against the season for deer being later. They wanted it in October The committee, however, stuck to their season, allowing only five day's in October, and the season decided for the country north of the French and Mattawa rivers will be from October 25th to November 30th."
