### ANNUAL MEETING OF THE HOLLINGER CONSOLIDATED.

Last Wednesday evening Thomas Hines, a farmer living near New Liskeard, committed suicide by hanging himself in his barn. Hines was about 35 years of age. He had been acting rather strangely for some weeks past and it is surmised that he hanged himself while suffering from temporary mental derangement.

### REGULAR "MOVIE" PLOT IN THIS MURDER STORY.

Some days ago Hector Dumont, of Sturgeon Falls, was committed for trial on the charge of murdering Cyril Raymond on April 23rd, 1919. Dumont was taken to North Bay jail to await trial. The story given to the police is to the effect that Dumont was a frequent visitor at the home of Raymond and one evening when Raymond went into his house he was seized and silenced for this world. The body was then taken to the bush where it was found some days later. In the meantime Dumont and Mrs. Raymond disappeared and stayed away about a year. They returned some days ago, however, and Dumont was taken into custody. According to the despatches, the woman has made a confession which implicates herself, Dumont and another man in the crime. This is the plot of one of the types of motion picture plays that was "run to death" some years ago, and is still occasionally used when nothing better can be thought of by the producers.

### NEAR A MILLION DOLLAR SURPLUS AT THE DOME.

The annual general meeting of the shareholders of the Dome Mines Company is scheduled for June 18th at Toronto. One of the features of the financial statement to be presented at the meeting is understood to be the item showing the surplus of the Dome Mines now to be practically a million dollars. This is a material increase over last year, and in many other items the Dome will also show similar pleasing progress during the year past. The Dome is one of the most efficiently managed mines of the North Land and has made a good showing through all the difficulties that have beset mining in the last few years.
