According to a despatch from Haileybury last week Mrs. Dan McMahon a well-known resident of the town, died at her home there on Tuesday last, May 18th. She leaves to mourn her loss, her husband, two children, three sisters, Mrs. Fred. Gervais Ottawa, Mrs. Fraser, Mattawa, Ont., and Mrs. L. Morris, Haileybury, and three brothers, one living in the Porcupine, one in the United States, and a smaller brother at her home in Haileybury. Before her marriage to Mr. McMahon, she was Miss Margaret McSweeney.

**SIR JOHN CARSON IS PRESIDENT NORTH CROWN.**

At the initial meeting of the North Crown Porcupine Mines, Sir John Carson was selected as President and Managing-Director. The despatch giving Mr. J. R. L. Starr as the president was in error last week in this particular, the mistake perhaps arising from the fact that Mr. Starr's name found first place on one of the lists of the directors. The directors of the North Crown Porcupine Mines are:—Sir John Carson, President and managing-director; J. R. L. Starr, K. C. W. I. Gear, J. B. Bartram, Percy Galt, K. C., James G. Ross C. M. G., A. G. Gardner and Ziba Gallagher. The North Crown Porcupine Mines is the new company organized to conduct the Porcupine Crown and Thompson-Krist properties recently amalgamated. Three of the directors represent Thompson-Krist interests and the President and five other directors are Porcupine Crown shareholders.

**MR. S. McCHESNEY DOES NOT LOSE MUCH TIME.**

On the evening of April 27th the mill owned and operated by Mr. McChesney, was destroyed by fire. The loss must have been as serious one to Mr. McChesney, but he showed the true spirit of the pioneer by refusing to be discouraged or dismayed. Instead, he went at it cheerfully instead to repair the damage, and in the four weeks since the fire the mill has been completely rebuilt, new machinery installed, and it is expected that this week will see the McChesney mill in operation again. As the settlers along the river remark these days, "You can't keep a good man down." The cheerfulness with which Mr. McChesney faced the disaster of the destruction of his mill, and the speed with which he has replaced it with a new one are of the type that make the true settler of the New North.

**MR. A. S. FULLER RETURNS TO PORCUPINE CAMP.**

Mr. A. S. Fuller, the well-known local mining man, returned to Camp last Sunday after a six months' sojourn in different parts of the United States. Mr. Fuller spent most of the past winter at the Commodore Hotel, New York City, where he established headquarters for optimistic information regarding the Porcupine Gold Camp and the mineral resources of Northern Ontario generally.

Mr. Fuller reports that the speculative public at the present time are principally interested in the great oil craze which is especially pronounced through the Southwestern part of the United States. Mr. Fuller spent several weeks in that section of the country looking into the oil situation in Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas and New Mexico.

His many friends here, however, will be glad to know that while the oil fields look very attractive and offer many inducements at the present time that it is his opinion that the mining possibilities of Northern Ontario offer capital a much safer and surer opportunity in the long run. Mr. Fuller is still enthusiastic as ever regarding the North Land's possibilities. He states that he is now negotiating a large deal involving about 15 of his properties in the Porcupine Gold Camp and expects to have it all closed inside of the next 30 days. He is leaving for Chicago in a few days where he will be joined by Mrs. Fuller who has been spending the later part of the winter in Southern California.

At the last regular meeting of the Haileybury Board of Trade the following resolution was passed:—"That whereas there is a great scarcity of coal, and whereas the present rate for hauling adds materially to the cost of cordwood, and whereas there is a large quantity of excellent hardwood near the south end of the T. & N. O. Railway, be it resolved that the Secretary write the Commission urging that the local rate for hauling cordwood be reduced in the interests of the inhabitants of the North Country, and that a copy of this resolution be sent to other Boards along the line."
