Miss Davidson of the Upper Canada Tract Society, was in the Camp last week collecting for the work of the Society.

Potatoes were reported last week as selling at \$11 per bag in Gowganda camp.

Mrs. V. Woodbury and Master Francis are away on a two months' vacation to be spent at the Thousand Islands and other places south.

Mrs. Twaddle, mother of Messrs W. and J. Twaddle, of town, arrived here last night from Scotland accompanied by her two other sons and her daughter. The family will take up residence on Elm street.

Mr. "Teddy" Oke, a well-known old-timer of the North Land, but now with the Thompson Powder Co., of Toronto, was a visitor to the Camp over the week-end in the interests of the new and improved explosive, "Thompsonite."

Timmins Girls' Baseball Team defeated the South Porcupine girls in a lively game at South End last Wednesday, the score being 23 to 9. Miss Plaunt pitched for Timmins and Miss I. Wilson for the South End team. Mr. J. T. Easton acted as umpire, being trained by his profession not to fear death.

Despatches from Cochrane say that the business men there are anxious now that there is a daily train service between Temiskaming and Western Canada that mail should be sent direct instead of round by North Bay and over the C.P.A. The Board of Trade has taken action in the matter and has written to the Post Office authorities suggesting that the services of the National be utilized to the desired end.

Iroquois Falls is generally considered this year as making effort to secure the classiest ball team ever gathered together in the North. Players are said to be secured from all directions. This double idea of Service, Rev. Mr. Parks also applied to the Orange Order, showing that faithfulness to the precepts of the Society meant also faithfulness in the service of their fellow-men.

They were married at North Bay, the home town of the bride who was formerly Miss Casey and was on the W.R. Lowery office staff here for some time past.
