### AIRMEN FLYING NORTH TO BELEHER ISLANDS.

According to information from Hamilton arrangements have been completed to pilot the big hydroplane owned by the Canadian Aero Film Company to the Beleher Islands in Hudson Bay. Capt Roy Maxwell, of Hamilton, is the pilot in charge, and he will be accompanied on the trip by Irwin Proctor, president of the Film Company; Geo. Doan, of Burlington, Ont., air engineer; Jack Hyde, Hamilton, chief rigger, and Roy Tash, Toronto, camera man. The party is making the trip to take aerial surveys and motion pictures in the far North. The hydroplane they are using is the latest type used in the U. S. navy. It has a 400 horse power engine and a gas tank with capacity for a 7 hour cruise or about 490 miles. The route laid out for the trip which was expected to start the end of last week was: Hamilton to Toronto, to Barrie and Orillia, to Muskoka and Algonquin Park, to North Bay, to Elk Lake, to Cochrane, to Moose Factory on James Bay, and then along the west coast of Labrador to the Beleher Islands. Stops will be made at the places mentioned to get supplies, etc.

As soon as the party reaches Beleher Island the plan is to return to Cochrane for a government engineer and other government officials who are to be with the motion picture party during their stay on the Islands. It is expected that Capt. Maxwell will go from Beleher Islands to Cochrane in about four or five hours. At the present time it takes the Indians more than that many days to make the trip.

The airmen expect to spend about three months in the far north. The Thertnos Company has presented the party with a complete camping outfit, and the Dominion Cartridge Co., with a supply of rifles and ammunition.

Capt. Maxwell recently tried his hydroplane in a trial trip over Lake Ontario. He encountered a bad storm while far out over the Lake, but found the airship was well suited for real work in all kinds of weather, and on his return he said the hydroplane was just what he needed in his business. He is confident that it will meet all the requirements for the long trip up north.

### HON. BENIAH BOWMAN'S TOUR OF THE NORTH LAND.

Speaking of the visit of Hon. Beniah Bowman to the North Land, The Cochrane Northland Post last week had the following to say:—

"Hon. Beniah Bowman, Minister of Lands and Forests, accompanied by Mrs. Bowman and Master Marvin Bowman and party, arrived in town last night in the T. & N. O. car Whitney attached to No. 4. The Minister has been visiting Port Arthur and Fort William and taking a general look over of the Crown Lands' and Timber Offices of his Department, in New Ontario. On the way down from the west they stopped off at Hearst and Kapuskasing and after leaving here on to-night's No. 4 for the South, they will visit on their way down Timmins, Iroquois Falls and Swastika. During the day the Minister has visited the different local offices of his Department here and this afternoon the Board of Trade is taking the party for an automobile drive in the surrounding country, after which the Minister will attend a special meeting of the Board of Trade at which roads and other pertinent matters will be discussed and representation made to the Minister for the dire needs of this district for more attention on the part of the Government."
