### NEW VEIN CUT ON KEORA 8 FEET WIDE AT 140 FEET

Keora Issues Report Reviewing Progress During Past Six Months.

Last week the Porcupine Keora issued a report covering the operations for the past six months. The report, which is signed by Wm. B. Ganton, the secretary, speaks for itself, and is in part as follows:—

"The development plan called for a shaft 250 feet and a crosscut 363 feet to the north, to cut the high grade ore located by diamond drilling in veins numbers five and six.

"This shaft is now completed, equipped and timbered to a depth of 150 feet, which a little more than passes the halfway mark in sinking.

"At a depth of about 140 feet and at the date of this writing, a highly mineralized vein showing a width of eight feet and dipping to the north, passed through the shaft. This discovery, the company's manager describes it as fine looking ore which may become of considerable importance, although it must be remembered that this is not included in our development expectations as outlined in our report of December last.

Vein No. 6.—Shows a width of 10 feet and an average value of \$47.50 in gold per ton.

#### ALLEGED SILVER FIND AT AMOS SAID TO BE "SALTED."

Recently there was a report of a big find of silver in the Hurriannaw district and there was a rush of prospectors to the section as a result. Prospectors coming back from Amos last week report that there was no genuine cause for the rush. They say that the silver found was in a crack in the mica schist into which had been forced by some artificial means a quantity of leaf silver. The "find," according to the prospectors, was nothing more nor less than an objectionable piece of "salting" that is not likely to do the district any good. No one knows who was responsible for the "salting" and this is just as well for the sake of law and order and the happy life. The injury to the district from the occurrence, however, is suggested by the fact that although other desirable minerals are reported as being uncovered in the Hurriannaw district prospectors do not show their usual keenness now to follow up these reports. "The men who do 'salting' are altogether too fresh," said one old prospector last week, "and they will not catch this bird again that way. I know there is gold in the Hurriannaw district, and you might tempt me to rush up there on reports of new finds of gold, but so far as silver, argentite, or any other kind of 'tite' is concerned yours truly will rush no more to Amos. #### FINED FOR SETTING FIRE WITHOUT PERMIT.

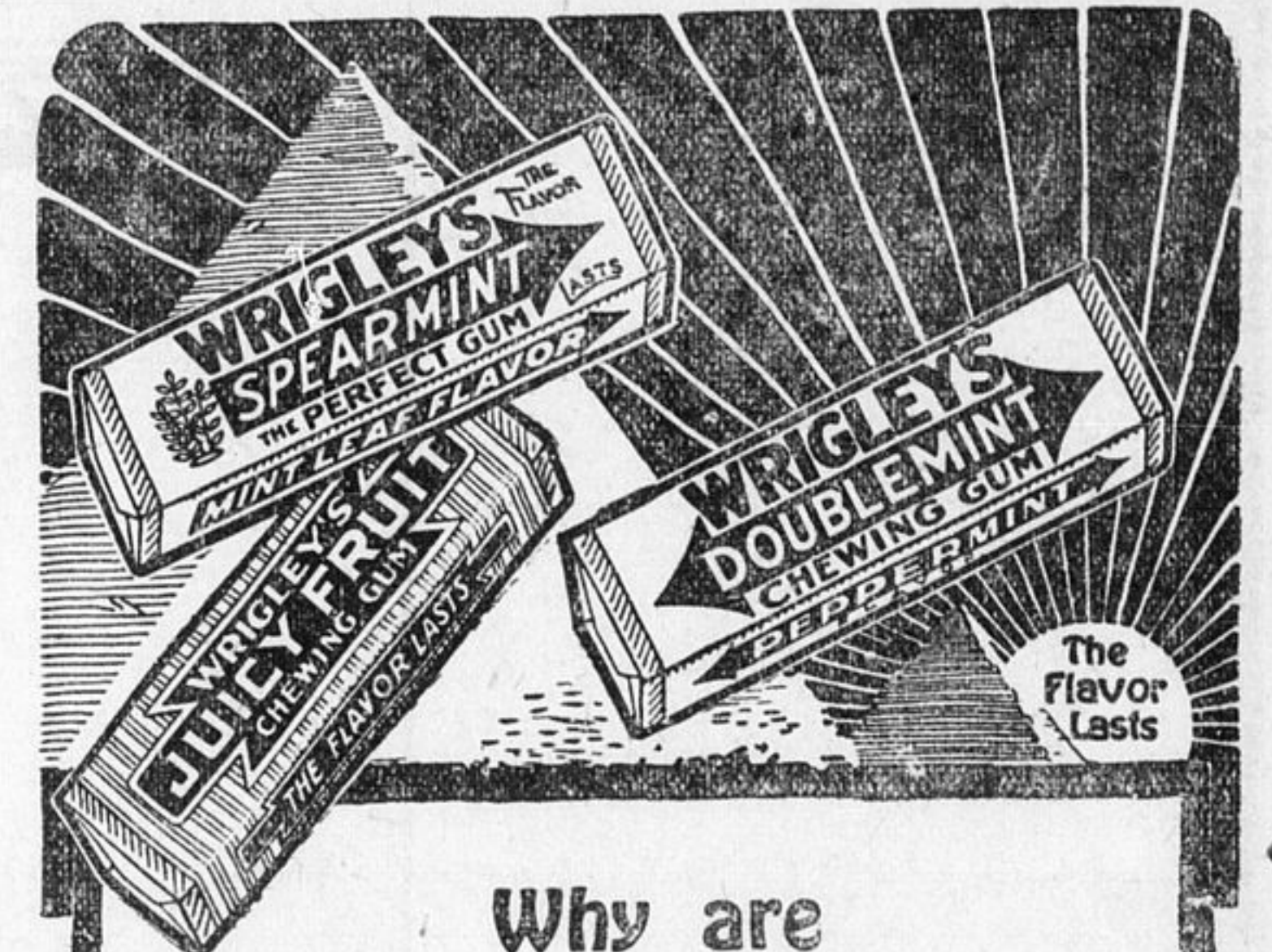
