Mrs. F. Hornby visited friends in Haileybury last week.

Mr. Peever, of Renfrew County, visited his daughters here over the week-end.

Mrs. J. P. Bartleman has been visiting in Timmins, accompanying her husband here on his return from a recent visit to Toronto.

Mr. E. P. Dean, of the Porcupine Pulp & Lumber Co., of Hoyle, is spending a few weeks' vacation at Niagara and other points south.

Messrs. Chas. Elliott and G. Minaker have opened a new and up-to-date restaurant at Haileybury which they are calling the "White Restaurant."

Mr. W. M. Widdifield returned on Thursday evening from a visit to the south, Niagara, Toronto, Newmarket and other places of interest being visited.

Last week gold was discovered at the 800-foot level of the Crown Reserve Silver mine at Cobalt. The assays are said to have indicated values of about \$12.00 per ton. The find is not considered as of any particular importance, but it is certainly interesting.
