H. A. AT COBALT OCT. 30**Representatives From Sixteen Towns
Of the North Land Invited To
Hockey Meet.

Secretary H. P. Charlton of the Northern Ontario Hockey Association has made the announcement that the annual meeting of the N.O.H.A. will be held in the Y.M.C.A. at Cobalt on Saturday, Oct. 30th. The executive of the N.O.H.A. will have a meeting first to conclude any outstanding business of the year, and then the general annual meeting will be commenced, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon. It is understood that invitations have been sent out to 16 different towns in the North Land asking them to have representatives at the annual meeting. While all of the sixteen are hardly expected to respond with duly accredited representatives, most of them it is thought will be represented at the meeting, which, as a consequence, should be an interesting and helpful gathering in the interests of North Land hockey.

In some ways there is considerable uncertainty in the hockey situation in Northern Ontario. One thing sure and certain is that the Porcupine and Iroquois Falls will have first class teams for the N.O.H.A. this coming season. New Liskeard and Sudbury are also reported as ready to put in good teams in the N.O.H.A. But Cobalt, North Bay, and even Haileybury may not have teams this year according to all accounts. North Bay may get in the League again all right if there is a different grouping, but otherwise may stay outside. Last season North Bay was grouped with Sudbury and the Soo and found this grouping a little too fast company and too far travelling. Cobalt and Haileybury have been unlucky in regard to players they thought they would have but who moved away around the residence rule date. They may, however, be able to dig up teams that will be acceptable and promising, before the season really commences. Some of the North Bay hockey fans are suggesting that North Bay be placed in the Central group of the N.O.H.A., with Haileybury, Cobalt and New Liskeard, and this may be found mutually agreeable.

The Porcupine and Iroquois Falls will undoubtedly play in the northern group again. It is not likely that there will be other teams for this

group, though, of course, all things are possible in a progressive country like the North Land. Iroquois Falls and the Porcupine, however, promise to have teams that will make sure very exciting and keenly contested games up this way. The building of a rink at Iroquois Falls will be a great advantage to the hockey players in the Paper Town, removing as it does one of the big handicaps they suffered under last year.

The outlook for good hockey this year in the N.O.H.A. this year is of the best, and the hockey enthusiasts are confidently looking forward to fast hockey this coming season.
