**LAST WEEK'S POLICE COURT LEADS TO MORE CASES.**

Growing from one of the police court cases last week there is another batch of cases for this week. Sadie Luroy last week was charged with disorderly methods of living, and Magistrate Atkinson sentenced her to three months in North Bay jail. The complaint was made by a Russian or Austrian, and the woman pleaded guilty. On account of her frank and truthful attitude the Magistrate was inclined to be lenient, and the penalty was accordingly less than it might otherwise have been. The story told by the woman, however, suggested an organized system of immorality as being possible in the place where she was rooming and this, together with charges suggested regarding the illegal sale of liquor on the premises, resulted in some arrests. A girl, known by various familiar nicknames around town, who had been a roomer in the same house was searched for on Thursday last after Sadie had been sentenced. The girl could not be found at first, but later Provincial Officer Moore arrested her at South Porcupine and brought her back to Timmins. She will be tried to-morrow. Bert Byek and his wife who conduct the pool-room and rooming house also faced charges last week, but on account of the illness of their infant child the case was adjourned for a week. In connection with the several cases, there are suggestions of charges and counter charges of all kinds being made and many think that some one may "spill the beans" before all the cases are dealt with.

Among the other cases dealt with by the police magistrate last week were a number of plain and ornamented drunks. Mareel Rurard, of the Mattagami River district, was also charged with illegal sale of liquor. He was fined \$500.00 and costs. The court to-morrow promises to be an unusually busy and interesting one, if half the charges and counter charges talked about are tried out in court.

A gentleman visiting in Iroquois Falls last week says that a Gun Club is to be organized in the very near future at the Falls, and in half joking fashion he suggests that Timmins sure must have a Gun Club, too, if the Falls has one. The idea, however, may be extended to Timmins and Cochrane and other nearby towns each having a Gun Club. Meets between the sharpshooters of the various towns would then prove a popular feature of sport in this part of the North Land.

**NOTED MINERALOGISTS VISITING NORTH LAND.**

Mr. Thos. W. Gibson, Deputy Minister of Mines for Ontario, and Dr. W. G. Miller, Provincial Geologist, are on a visit to the North Land. They are making a general survey of the mining fields of this part of Ontario, calling at Cobalt, Kirkland Lake, Gowganda, Timmins and other camps. This is the first official visit for a number of years.

**NEW LISKEARD PLANS TO HAVE FINE HOCKEY TEAM.**

According to Jack Marks, the new manager and coach of the New Liskeard Hockey team, the Creamery Town expects to have some class in its speedy line-up this year. A gymnasium has been fitted up for the team and the boys are being trained to physical condition, the work being already under way. Manager Marks says the boys are showing up remarkably well, and he expects to have them all in the best of physical condition, hardened and winded before the ice is ready. The boys have all sorts of "pep," and are shaping up to put New Liskeard on the hockey map in big letters this year, says their new manager. "It's a winning team; just watch it," he says.
