**TIMMINS WAS A VERY GOOD TOWN THIS WEEK.**

This week practically every regular policeman in the district is in Haileybury in connection with one or more cases coming before the Supreme Court there. Chief Wilson, Constables Laporte and Greer, and Special Officer R. Allen are among those called to Haileybury from Timmins this week. Fire Chief A. Borland and Deputy Fire Chief J. T. Easton were also among those summoned as witnesses in one or another of the many cases coming before the court from this district. The most of the witnesses from town were called in connection with the case of the King vs. Mrs. N. Aboud. In this connection Chief McInnis of South Porcupine and Constable Rayeroff, of Moneta, were also required in the County Town this week. The Mayor, Town Solicitor and other officials were also required to attend at Haileybury in connection with the case of Mr. A. White against the Town. Mr. White is claiming damages for loss he considers he sustained through the use by the Town of his house near the Whelpdale mine. Mr. White bases his case on the use by the Town without his knowledge or permission of the house referred to as an isolation hospital for a smallpox case. The Town was willing to pay all necessary expenses to leave the house and contents in as good condition as when taken over, fumigate the place thoroughly, and in addition pay Mr. White one hundred dollars for the use of the building for the few weeks the Town had use of it as an isolation hospital. Mr. White thinks he is entitled to further remuneration than offered, as his plans for moving the building, etc., were completely upset. The case will likely be decided this week at Haileybury. With all the policemen thus out of

the town and district, it is the common humorism this week to remark on how quiet and orderly everything is going along. Those who take things more seriously reply, however, that the town and district have been provided with police protection during the absence of the regular local and Provincial police. Mr. E. A. Roy, formerly Chief of Police for Tisdale, is acting Chief for Timmins, with Constable Albert Despathis as assistant. In the absence of Chief Chas. Melnis and Provincial Officer W. Moore, Bailiff H. W. Warren has charge of law and order at South End, and he laughs at the jokes about any trouble. "We are a law-abiding, quiet, orderly people," he says, "and if any strangers arrive and there is any trouble that I can't smooth over, I'll call on Constable Bennett at Schumacher. What can't be handled with his help will need the calling out of the troops." Fireman W. G. Smith is acting fire chief during the absence of Chief Borland. The local officials now in Haileybury may be back in town in a day or so, or may be away for a week. The length of court sessions is proverbially uncertain.

**SHOULD NOT HAVE ASKED MAN TO COME OUTSIDE.**

Last week at Toronto Mr. Justice Rose granted an order quashing the conviction of Arthur Martel of Cochrane on the charge of being intoxicated in a public place. According to the story given at Osgoode Hall, J. Martel, the Cochrane man in question had gotten in a 'couple of cases of liquor last September. The Cochrane Chief of Police called upon him a few days after and wanted to know where he had secured his liquor. Martel was supposed to smell of liquor when the Chief was talking to him, and the Chief made the suggestion that Martel should go to the police station and discuss the matter there. As soon as Martel stepped off his own property the Chief is said to have arrested him for having liquor in a public place. The representative of the Attorney-General appearing before Mr. Justice Rose in the case admitted that the conviction should not have been made. The conviction was quashed and remitting the \$20.00 fine. Martel's lawyer emphasized the impropriety of getting Martel away from his own private house to arrest him. "He should never have been invited outside," said the lawyer.

Good old Golden City has beaten the whole North Land in the matter of securing war trophies. Last week two guns—a big gun and a machine gun,—arrived as war trophies for Golden City.

Mr. Sam. Moses, of Timmins, and Mr. Sam Oscar, of Schumacher, will be among those sailing on Saturday of this week for overseas. Their destination is Beirut, Syria, where they have business and other interests.

Mr. S. R. Rawlinson, who has been visiting in Toronto and other points south for the past two weeks, will sail from Montreal on Saturday of this week to spend the winter at his old home in England.

There are now nearly fifty restaurants in Sudbury, according to The Star. They must be a hungry lot in the Nickel Town. Timmins has seven restaurants, but in poolrooms and bars this town has Sudbury or any other town beaten seven ways.

Friends in the Camp will be pleased at the word received in town last week to the effect that Mrs. J. Johnson, formerly of Schumacher, but now of New York, is making very satisfactory progress to completely recovered health. Mr. Johnson was on the engineering staff of the McIntyre-Porcupine Mine. Some five or six months ago, Mr. and Mrs. Johnson left the Camp intending to take a trip to the Old Country. Mrs. Johnson, however, was taken ill and has been in hospital since. Mr. Johnson is now in business for himself in New York and permanently located there. Mrs. Johnson is convalescent and is making excellent progress to complete recovery.

Mr. E. H. Hill, Division Court Clerk of South Porcupine, was a visitor to town this week. He has just recovered from a peculiar accident. Recently he had been taking medicine for some minor ailment and this medicine contained something in the line of strychnine. The bottle not being thoroughly shaken each time before its use, the strychnine accumulated at the bottom, and last week while taking one of the last doses, an overdose of strychnine was received. Mr. Hill was seriously affected, and it was necessary to have expert medical attention and the use of the stomach pump, etc., to save him from the danger of poisoning.

**TRAINLOAD OF BEEFERS FOR THE QUEEN CITY.**

The largest stock train that ever passed through Cochrane, according to the Post, arrived last week over the Canadian National Railways, consisting of 60 cars of cattle billed to Toronto. After feeding and watering the beefers, the train went south on the T. & N. C., having made the run from Winnipeg in 40 hours. While these beefers from the west were only given water to drink at Cochrane, the local beefers at Cochrane always beef if they can't get anything stronger than water to drink. They usually do.

Gemmill and the plaintiff to the Belecher Island Iron Deposit Syndicate.

**ATLAS AT WESTREE TO START UP AGAIN SOON.**

Mr. Alex. M. Bilsky, the president, and a number of the directors of the Atlas Mine, visited the property in the Westree district recently, and as a result of the visit it was decided to resume work at an early date. The programme now planned includes development work on an extended scale. It has been decided to install a four-drill compressor, as well as drilling outfits to carry along the work planned.
