Some days ago Hamilton B. Wills & Co. applied for and secured a temporary injunction on behalf of themselves and other shareholders, restrain ing the Wasapika Gold Mines from distributing the assets of the Company in the manner planned by the directors. Last week argument was heard on the injunction and further restraint was not considered encessary The idea of the Hamilton B. Wills Co. in asking for the injunction was to protect the shareholders of the Wasapika in every way, and this has largely been accomplished through the publicity given the court proceedings. The brokerage firm were not objecting so much to the distribution as to the method of making it. Hamilton B. Wills & Co wanted the usual procedure followed of placing the new stock in the hands of a trust company to be exchanged or distributed there on presentation of the old stock. Among the recent instances where this plan was satisfactorily used was the case of the exchange of Dome for Dome Extension stock. Hamilton B. Wills also objected to the time limit set for the exchange of stock in the

Wasapika case. According to the action at Osgoode Hall where the motion for further injunction was dismissed, the directors of Wasapika may now proceed to distribute the shares to shareholders as planned and in accordance with the On tario Companies Act. The court considered that the shareholders were be-
