**KIRKLAND LAKE WINS DICKSON FOOTBALL CUP**

**Strenuous Game at Dome Results in No Score and Kirkland is Thus Ahead One Point.**

Kirkland Lake won the Dickson Cup on Saturday last, when they played the game, no score, with the Dome on the latter's grounds. The game was a very hard fought game, with Dome apparently the better team on the play, though unable to score. This tie game left the teams standing as follows for the first N.O.F.A. series, for the Dickson Cup:—

Harrower won the toss, not gaining any advantage. G. Cadman kicked off before a very large and enthusiastic crowd. Right from the start it was to be seen that the Lake were going to be content with a draw, as they started in playing purely defensive football, breaking away only spasmodically, and at no time did they look at all likely to score, with one exception only, when Hawkins was out of goal, Conlin missing this great opportunity. Curboy had put his knee out right at the start of the game, throwing the "Dome" combination work out of gear, although close to the interval, as brilliant a piece of combination play was manipulated by Harrower to Wallace to McKenna to Lucas which took the ball the whole length of the field, Lucas finishing up with a beautiful attempt which hit the side of the net. Halftime arrived with no score, the Dome having had by far the best of the play. Re-starting, another misfortune befell the home team, McKenna being put out of action by McPhail. Dome were now playing with great dash and vigor, but Elrick was not to be beaten, his display in goal being superb. The "Dome" forwards were considerably outweighed by the more robust Lake defence, and what should have been an interesting period of play, was spoiled (from a spectator's point of view) by the deliberate kicking into touch of the whole Lake team, and the way in which they were checking the "Dome" attack. Some of their tactics appeared most questionable. Right on time, Lynn gave away a penalty in deliberately fouling Lucas.

Airey being entrusted with the kick. Much to the disappointment of the crowd, he kicked right into Elrick, who had no difficulty in clearing. For the Lake, unquestionably Elrick's display stands out as the one redeeming feature for his team in their efforts which were of a defensive nature only. Ramsey at back played a sound hard game, and Hamilton in the forward line was the pick. For the "Dome" they all played well, but they were unable to settle down. Carrying two cripples throughout a game with so much at stake was too much of a handicap and under the circumstances the only wonder is that the Lake didn't pile up a score. The "Dome" team were the first to congratulate the Lake on winning the Cup, and are hoping that a different tale will be told in the game for the King Cup. Opening Games in King Cup Schedule
